PORTSMOUTH COUNCIL

BUSINESS BEFORE FINAL MEETING MONDAY NIGHT.

Justice Department Will be Asked to Undertake Reconstruction of Culvert Through the Village. Used for Draining Prison Farm.

The final meeting of the year of the Portsmouth Council was held on Monday evening, with all the members present. The following communications were received:

From the acting warden of the penitentiary stating that the request of the council, that the institution place two lights on Union street, between Palace street and the end of the wall, will be granted, providing the village becomes responsible for maintenance of lamp and fixtures. This was agreed to.

From the chairman of the Board of Governors of the Tuberculosis hospital, stating that the village could not collect taxes from the institution. An opinion was enclosed from W. F. Nickle, K.C., to this effect.

A letter was submitted by Councilor Halliday, from Dr. E. Ryan, stating that he would have lights placed on the street fronting Rockwood hospital property, providing the village assumed all responsibility in connection with the installation. The clerk was instructed to write, accepting the conditions.

The justice department at Ottawa will be asked to undertake the reconstruction of the culvert through the village, which is used for draining the prison farm. The overflow from the drain causes considerable damage at certain times.

The outstanding accounts for the year were ordered to be paid. The financial statement for the year was read and adopted and copies ordered to be printed.

A by-law was passed, confirming the agreement between the Kingston Utilities committee and the village, regarding street lighting.
