Of the Italian Policy-Address Reply to Those Who Criticized the Renewal of the Alliance,

Rome, Dec. 20 .- In a brilliant speech, which was frequently interrupted by outbursts of applause, Marquis di San Giuliano, the fore'gn minister, replied in the Chamber of Deputies to those who critirized the renewal of the Triple Al-

The minister eulogized the Triple Alliance, which, he said had been for thirty years the strongest guarantee of the peace of the whole of Europe. It had permitted Italy to achieve wonderful progress, despite innumerable difficulties, bota internal and external, and it was one of the princ'pal factors in the great economic advancement, and by more closely welding the interests of the civilized world and maxing them more independent it constituted a new and powerful ob, stacle to a great war not determine ed by the supreme necessities of national existence and dignity.

It was eminently able, he confinued, to guarantee the interests of the three nations party to it in the Balkans, but it must give assurance to them of mutual support, not only at the present time but in the future. Each ally must be of the conviction that it could depend on the support to-morrow of the others in return for what it old for those others to-day. That must be an essential element in the efficacy of the alliance. Therefore, he maintained, the experience of thirty years and the exigencies of the present s'tuation justified the renewal of the Triple Alliance.
