Universal Jubilee in Commemoration of Edict.
Rome, March 19.—Pope Pius has published an apostolic letter, decreeing a universal jubilee from Low Sunday, March 30th, to December 8th, the Feast of Immaculate Conception, in commemoration of the religious toleration edict issued by Emperor Constantine in the fourth century.
The faithful must come to Rome and visit twice the churches of St. John Lateran, St. Peter's and St. Paul's, praying, confessing, receiving communion and giving alms, or they must visit six times churches chosen by their own bishops and carry out the same devotions. Those thus attending the jubilee will obtain a plenary indulgence.

SPORT EVENTS AT QUEEN'S.

Calvin, Raitt and McCartney starred for science, while all the arts team played effectively, the shooting of Leishmann being especially noteworthy in the extra period.
