## FINANCIAL TIDINGS THE SPORT REVIEW

### CONSOLIDATION OF THE PRINCIPAL CASKET COMPANIES.

J. C. Wilson Paper Co. is Issuing \$600,000 Bonds—Commercial News.

Montreal, April 11.—Lorne S. Webster was yesterday elected the first president of Dominion Manufacturers, Limited, the new consolidation of the principal casket companies of Ontario and Quebec.

The balance of the board is composed as follows: W. Marshall, vice-president; and Messrs. F. W. Coles, London, Ont.; A. J. H. Eckardt, Toronto; J. S. Elliott, Prescott; H. L. Gordin, Three Rivers; and F. J. Knox, of the Montreal Securities company.

The capitalization of the new company is \$3,000,000, divided into \$2,000,000 common and \$1,000,000 preferred stock. The lead office will be in Montreal.

Six of the largest casket manufacturers of eastern Canada are consolidated in the concern, the list being: Globe Casket Co., Toronto; Semmens-Evel Casket Co., Limited, Hamilton; National Casket Co., Toronto; Christie Bros. & Co., Limited, Amherst, N. S.; J. S. Elliott & Sons, Prescott; and Girard & Gordin, Three Rivers.

Several subsidiary companies will also be operated by the new concern.

The J. C. Wilson company, of Montreal, which was founded by the late J. C. Wilson, some forty-two years ago, has so grown that it is to-day one of the largest concerns of its kind in Canada.

The company is now making an offering of \$600,000 of first mortgage 6 per cent. 25-year sinking fund gold bonds, at 100 and interest. Back of these bonds, the company possesses total fixed assets of \$1,600,000 and net current assets of \$532,000, or total assets of over \$2,132,000. The profits for the year 1912 were given at \$295,000, equal to almost six times the annual bond interest.

### Cedar Rapids Bonds Unsold.

Montreal, April 11.—More complete figures of the amount of Cedar Rapids bonds left on the hands of the underwriters give a total of \$1,671,000, or a little over 41 per cent. of the underwriting, of \$4,000,000 on a total issue of \$8,000,000.

### International Power.

London, Eng., April 11.—International Light and Power company, registered in Canada and operating in South America, is offering \$1,000,000 in cumulative preferred 6 per cent. stock with a bonus of \$60 in common.

### Financial Notes.

Dominion Steel is listed on the London, England, Stock Exchange, registered in Canada and operating in South America, is offering \$1,000,000 in cumulative preferred 6 per cent. stock with a bonus of \$60 in common.

Chicago will shortly receive \$2,500,000, being 55 per cent. of net for 1912 from operations of surface traction lines.

During the month of March, according to Houston, there were twenty-five new branch banks opened in Canada and six closed.

Standard Oil of Kansas is to double its capital stock from \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000, with the customary "melon" cutting.

The city of Prince Albert offers \$513,500 1/2 per cent. debentures at 86, which allows nearly 5 1/2 per cent. in interest.

General Electric company's \$10,000,000 5 per cent. debentures, due 1952, have been admitted to trading on the New York Stock Exchange.

Liabilities of concerns failing in United States during first quarter of 1913 were heavier than for any similar period since 1908.

Dayton business men are formulating plan to borrow \$40,000,000 from government for rehabilitation, with \$60,000,000 banking and building loans collateral.

The Canadian Oil company, limited, has been authorized to increase its capital stock from \$2,000,000 to \$2,600,000 by the creation of 6,000 shares, 8 per cent. preference stock.

Net profits of Canada Machinery Co. last year amounted to \$105,056.04, and the sales have increased to a very large extent, so that this year, it is said in some quarters, will show a satisfactory increase.

Dividends and interest disbursements on Canadian stocks and bonds this month will amount to about \$31,089,271, of which \$17,039,201, or considerably more than half, will be on listed securities.

It is reported the Hollinger in March produced gold to the value of over \$200,000. Four weekly dividend payments call for \$90,000. The March output, therefore, if confirmed, would enable the board to place more than \$100,000 to surplus.

For a Great Baseball Infielder—Some Baseball History—No More Coaxing of Cobb To Be Done By Detroit Baseball Club President.

President Edward Barrow of the International baseball league has accepted an invitation to be present at the opening game of the Grays at Providence next Wednesday.

The senator of the Minnesota legislature killed the Hoeller bill legalizing limited boxing contests in this state.

Major league baseball teams have already begun cutting down their salaries in preparation for compliance with the 25-player limit rule.

Toronto baseball team will play at Scranton and Whitehorse on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

Manager George Stallings, of Boston, has made an offer for Pitcher Frank Smith, of Montreal.

President Navin, of Detroit, says he is going to make no further inducements to Ty Cobb. In the meantime Cobb has disbanded his stars for a week, pending developments from Detroit.

Following the example set by the Montreal and Shamrock Athletic associations, the Capital lacrosse club will abandon professional lacrosse.

Namtoha will have six weeks of racing this year, with \$70,000 in prizes. The Fort Garry Turf Club in Winnipeg will open the season on June 26th. The speed purses at Winnipeg exhibition, July 8th to 16th, amount to \$32,000.

Vancouver lacrosse amateurs will remain intact this year, and if they win the Mann cup will be taken for a trip to England in the fall. Next season they will try to secure a franchise in the professional league.

Manager Frank Chano of the New York Highlanders, has released Pitcher "Parley" Green to the Pittsburgh club, third baseman Priest to Rochester, and Pitcher Davis to Jersey City.

The Guelph council has agreed to put the exhibition grounds in first-class condition for the Canadian league club. In the event that the grounds are not in condition to play on by April 21st, when the team report, it is likely arrangements will be made to train at Preston with the Peterboro' White Caps.

The Niagara Racing association has opened its stakes for the two meetings to be held this year at the Fort Erie track. The Canadian derby, \$3,500, will be the top-liner for the spring meeting, while the \$5,000 Dominion Handicap, one of the most valuable of stakes in recent years, will be renewed as the chief attraction for the second meeting.

A Winnipeg war canoe will probably compete this year at the C.C.A. regatta. The Winnipeg Canoe club have practically decided to send down a full war canoe, which will enter the mile and half-mile events. They may also send down some triars.

That Le Marin, the Belgian, will defeat Zbyso in the match arranged at Chicago, and also Gotch, thereby becoming the champion heavyweight wrestler of the world, is the opinion of Charles Cutler, the American, who was defeated at Montreal this week by Constant Le Marin, the idol of the Montreal wrestling fans.

### What Makes Infielder?

What makes a great infielder? The fan will say it is ability to cover ground, take difficult balls, hit well, run the bases with sense and keep alive to the team work on the defense.

Ball players will tell you, "A good pair of hands."

The great big fielding secret is ability to shift hands, and Eddie Grant, the fast fielding third baseman under Joe Tinker, can switch his hands quicker than any fielder in the business. He is a regular Herman the Great when it comes to proving that the hands are faster than the eyes.

The position of the hands in catching a ball makes all the difference in the world and there are two principal ways to make a catch. The hands are held one way for balls above the waist and another way for those below the waist.

Ball batted on the ground frequently takes eccentric "hops," and good infielders must change their hands rapidly to make the stop and throw. The man who cannot shift his hands rapidly works under a big handicap.

Ever since he broke into the big show Grant has been rated as one of the best fielding third basemen living, and the difference in his work and that of others is largely in the speed with which his hands move.

Grant is a wonder at playing ground balls that bound badly. His hands are never in an awkward position, when he grabs the ball and rarely does he carry an injured finger.
