Scutari at Once.

BY THE AGED AUSTRIAN EM-PEROR FRANCIS JOSEPH

Who Puts, the Blame For the Trouble at the Door of the Powers _Thursday is the Day Given For Evacuation.

London, April 30.-Austria-Hungary will deliver a twenty-four-hour ultimatum to Montenegro to-day, commanding King Nicholas to surrender and evacuate Scutari by Thursday. If ! this is not complied with Austria will immediately declare war against Montenegro and begin the movement of troops across the Albanian and Montenegrin frontiers.

This decision was semi-officially and nounced last night in Vienna by Count Von Berchtold, foreign minister, following his two-hour conference with Emperor Francis Joseph


