

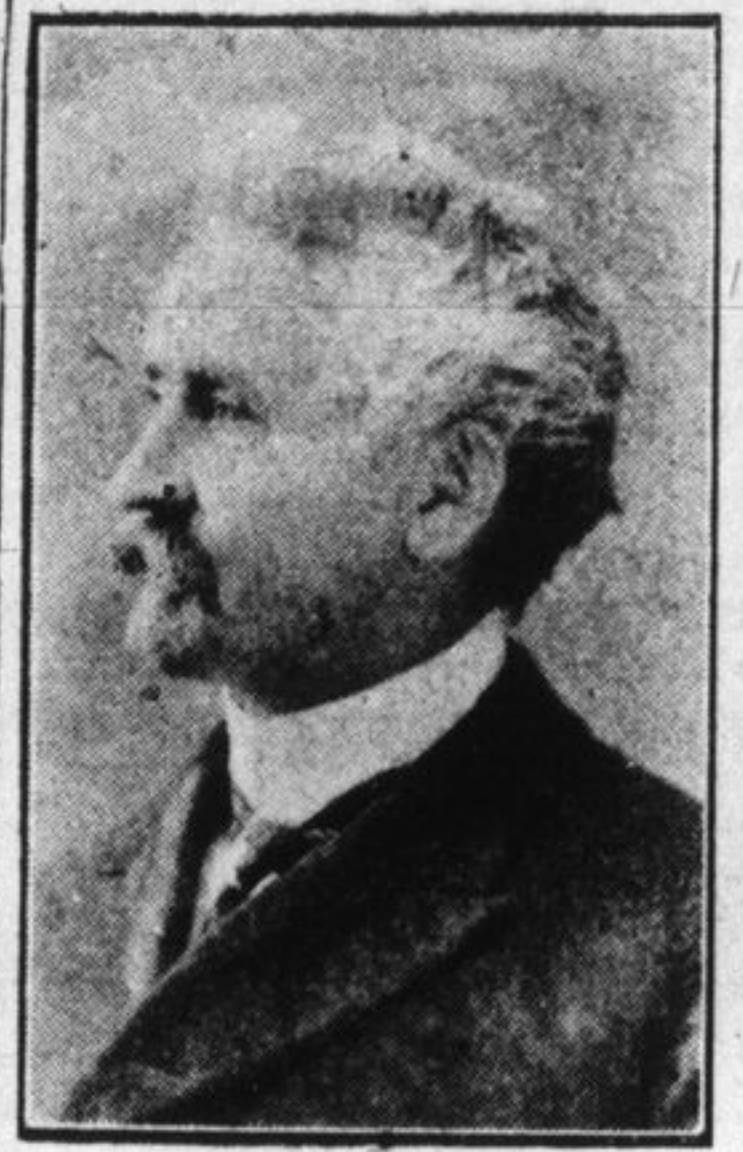
BULGARIA NOW OFFERS ROUMANIA TERRITORY

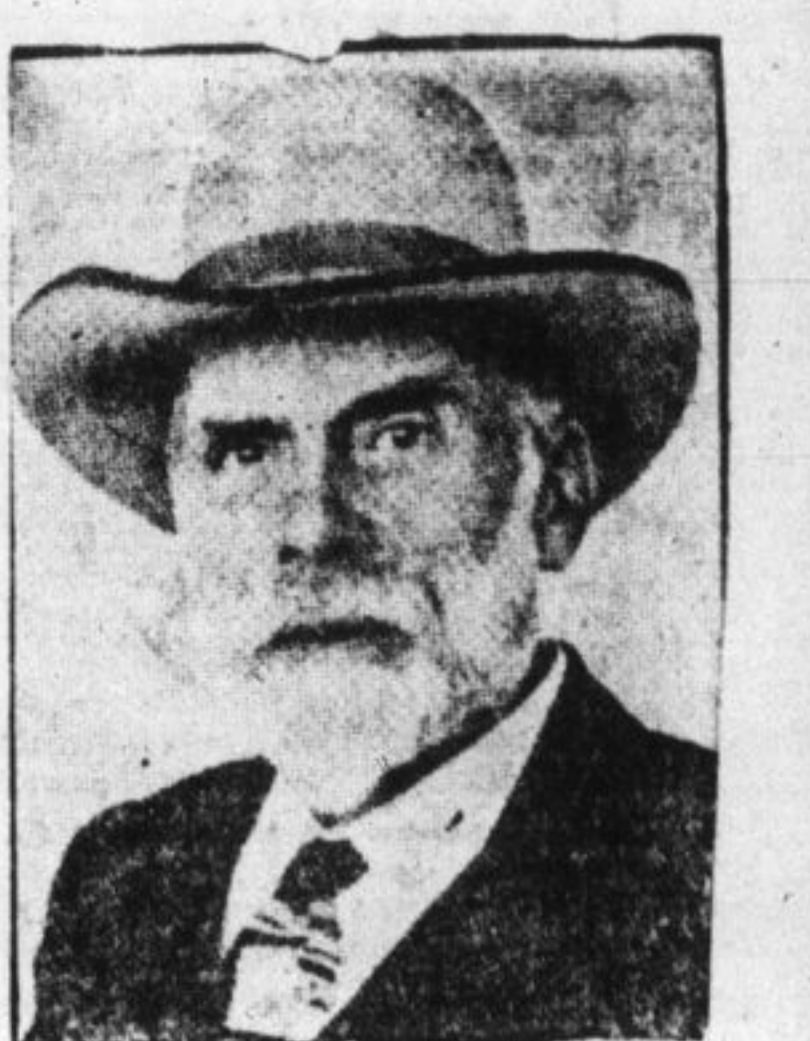
