"I plead guilty," said Frederick Scrivens, when arraigned in police court, Saturday, charged with stealing four pair of boots from John Green, Princess street. The magistrate gave him three months in jail. Scrivens was arrested by Constable Berzigan.

John Joyce, arrested in connection with the holding up and robbing of H. C. Gibson, on Swift's wharf, was committed for trial. J. J. Kiney appeared for him, and he pleaded "not guilty."
