**Tips For the Farmer**

some of the milk will be drawn into the calf's mouth.

After several times of this operation all that will be necessary is to place the fingers to the mouth of the calf and lower them to the milk pail when the calf will drink without further aid. Within a few days it will drink without personal assistance.

At first feed the young calf about two quarts of whole milk twice a day fresh from the cow. As the calf grows older this amount may be increased according to the size of the calf and other general feeding conditions. At about one week of age skim-milk may be used for one feed each day, and by the end of the second week skim-milk may be given at both feeds. The skim-milk should always be warmed to about blood temperature. When the calf is about three weeks old it may be taught to eat bran and shelled corn and one ear of corn to the feed is about the right quantity.

With the exception of milk, give the young calf dry feeds. Allow it access to hay or corn husks, which it will soon learn to chew and eat. Some are troubled with scours, but give feed regularly and in regular amounts, with never over-feeding, and you will experience little difficulty.

**Raising Ducks.**

Duck-raising is one of the most profitable branches of the poultry business.

For market purpose the Pekin duck is best. For eggs the Indian Runner takes the lead.

Indian Runners are good foragers and light eaters.

Ducks are never troubled with lice, neither do they have cholera or roup.

The Indian Runners grow very rapidly and begin laying early. They lay a large white egg. These eggs have a very fine flavor.

You will find the eggs not as fertile if you let the ducks grow thin. Give the ducklings plenty of air, sand over their feed, and this will be a sure way of getting as much as they need.

**A Profitable Industry.**

What is reported to be a very profitable industry is being carried on by fishermen along Lake Erie. Sturgeon are very valuable for oil which is extracted from \$50 to a piece. Lucky fishermen have been known to make as high as \$500 in one night, and one firm just cleared \$10,000 on the season. These remarkable successes have aroused the sporting and sportsman interest of several farmers and farm laborers, who have forsaken their work in the green hills far away. A license fee of \$5 is charged for each net, and this money is used to replenish the hatcheries.

**Green Crops for Sheep.**

Sheep are most at home in pasture fields. They feed not only on the tender grass blades, but they strip weeds and other foul plants of their leaves and branches. They are in truth the plant scavengers of the farm. When turning to pasture from dry feed lots the change should be made gradually. An afternoon is best when no moisture is on the grass. After feeding on this pasture for a short time return in this manner for a few days and little, if any, digestive disturbances will arise. After four or five days the sheep will be accustomed to green feed.

Sheep should have a change of pastures. Kept on the same land in the same field year after year, without change, the pastures become foul, disease lurks in the soil and dangerous parasites accumulate. For these reasons sheep should be changed frequently from field to field from year to year, and except in the case of well established permanent pastures, crop rotation should be followed so that the fields may be clean of disease and parasites, and may be ever fresh with new growing grass crops.

**Raising Calves.**

A great factor in raising calves by hand is that they become very gentle and confident in human handling. This is a very important item, especially where heifers are kept for milk cows. The gentle and confident cow, which is to be handled for ten to fifteen years, is almost a priceless animal. In taming domestic animals there is nothing that will win their confidence so quickly as feeding, allowing them to eat in your presence. You have satisfied their vital needs, and they will always feel that your presence is an assurance for something good.

In raising a calf by hand, allow it to suckle the cow only two or three times at first. Many prefer not to let it suckle the cow at all. At the first hand feed place warm milk fresh from the cow in a shallow pail or pan and place two of your fingers in its mouth. As it begins to suck on the fingers, draw its mouth in contact with the warm milk. By moving the two fingers apart a little
