THE FEAR OF RABIES
CAUSES TWO DOCTORS TO SEEK TREATMENT
Imaginary Rabies Caused Man's Death - Had Been Harmlessly Bitten by a Dog and Then Charmed by Friends.
London, Ont., Jan. 5.—Dr. John Hunt of Fort William, and Dr. William Hunt of Fort William, sons of Mr. C. B. Hunt of this city, left yesterday for Toronto to take the Pasteur treatment. The two physicians, who were on a holiday visit to their parents several days ago, were playing with a pet dog, when the animal suddenly developed symptoms of rabies, which caused its death.
Neither of the men were bitten, but fearing possible infection through scratches on their hands it was thought best not to take any chances. The dog was a valuable bull-dog which had taken many prizes.

Caused Man's Death
Syracuse, N. Y., Jan. 5.—Hydrophobia, brought on by fright, rather than rabies, killed J. E. Hubbell, a former clerk of Onondaga county and prominent in politics.
He was bitten in the face November 20th, while teasing a pet bull-dog. The wound was immediately cauterized and later tetanus antitoxin was administered. Examination of the dog by experts showed him free from rabies. No alarming symptoms developed until Monday, when Mr. Hubbell began to have trouble with his throat and showed symptoms of fear of water. It became known then that friends had joked Hubbell on the possibility of hydrophobia and being of nervous temperament it preyed on his mind until the dread malady really became manifest.
Diagnosing the case as one of auto-hydrophobia, attending doctors used all possible psychological means, but their efforts failed and death ended his sufferings.

Snapdragon and Halloween.
Many of our Halloween customs come to us from England and Scotland, and a most popular one is called the "snapdragon," which is brought in when refreshments are served, generally at the last before leaving the table. The lights are all turned out and the platter containing the snapdragon is brought in. Why it is thus named I know not, but it is made this way: Place large table raisins quite closely and evenly on the platter, sprinkle with salt and cover with good alcohol. Just before bringing in light the alcohol and a most ghastly greenish white light will be the result. Press it around the table, and each guest is to try to grab a raisin from the flame. Now, don't ask me why and wherefore regarding this strange custom, for I do not know; only my earliest recollections of a Halloween party, and I regret to say that it is many years ago, we had a snapdragon, and an English lady told me how to make it. Sometimes ghost stories are told while the dragon burns on the table.—St. Louis Globe-Democrat.
