CITY COUNCIL SESSION

PEACE CELEBRATION TO BE HELD IN KINGSTON

Council to Co-operate With Centenary Committee—A Refund of Taxes to Mrs. E. Gaskin.

At the City Council meeting last evening Mayor Shaw and Aids. Bews, Couper, Fair, Graham, Gillespie, Hanley, Harrison, Hoag, Hughes, Litton, McCann, Newman, Nickle, Peters, Richardson, Sutherland, Stroud and White were in attendance.

These communications were read: Great Waterways Legion of Canada, re (Georgian Bay canal scheme and the Welland canal.

Organizing secretary of the Canadian Peace Centenary Association, re holding a celebration in Kingston in the summer of 1915.

Municipal Franchise Referendum committee, re municipal franchise for married women taxpayers.

Children's Aid Society, applying for grant of \$300.

Ladies' Auxiliary, Hotel Dieu, asking refund rent of city hall.

R. J. McClelland, inspector of buildings, recommending the appointment of Calvin Jackson as city chimney viewer.

Frontenac Lumber and Coal company, applying for the extension of their Grove Inn wharf, King street west, as per plan filed with city engineer.

Residents of Raplan Road, between Sydenham and Patrick street, asking for a sewer and gas main—Granted, on motion of Aids. Harrison and Couper.

This resolution was adopted, on motion of Aids. Harrison and Fair: That whereas this city has been selected by the Canadian Peace Centenary Association as one of the cities in which to hold a celebration of the hundred years of peace between the British Empire and the United States...

A resolution of Aids. Graham and Couper to refund the amount was carried on a ye and nay vote, by 15 to 4, those voting nay being Aids. Fair, Harrison, McCann and Richardson.

In order to help out W. J. Baker against whom there has been a police court charge for the past two months for erecting an electric sign in front of the Orpheum theatre on Princess street in violation of the city by-laws, Ald. Graham moved, seconded by Ald. Sutherland...

Nays—Mayor Shaw, and Aids. Bews, Couper, Harrison, Hughes, Hoag, Litton, Nickle—8.

Yea—Aids. Graham, Gillespie, McCann, Newman, Peters, Richardson, Stroud, Sutherland, White—9.

On motion of Aid. Hughes, the council decided to ask the Board of Education to prepare for use in the city schools short, interesting pamphlet dealing with such facts and data of the city as it sees fit.

Repairs Intake Pipe The contractor authorized the manager to have repairs made to the waterworks suction pipe, terminating at the Montreal Transportation company slip.

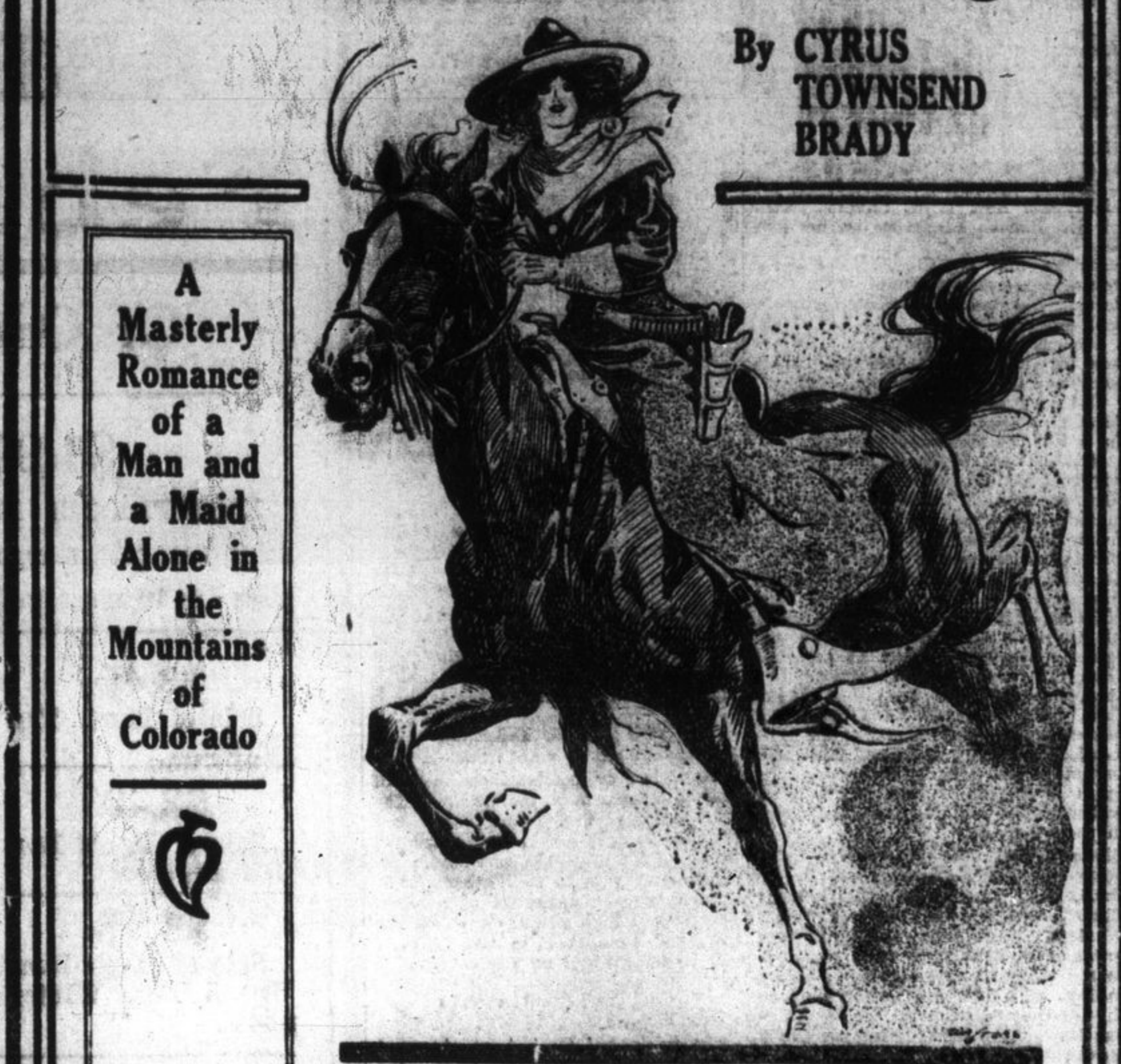
