Thore is every promise that the breeding of these animals for mohair, milk and goat venison will be developed into an important industry. While the climatic conditions of the countries further south permit the Angora goat to grow hair for only one year before shedding, the dry

cool atmosphere of Alberta enables the animal to carry its two years' growth without any fear of shedding The hair grown from year to year is worth only 35 cents to 50 cents a pound. The two-year product is worth upward of \$6 a pound.

The value of goat meat is said to he equal to that of mutton, and is used to .. large extent throughout in countries, here the goat raising industry is extensively followed. taste it is much similar to venison.

Wheat In New Quebec? Extraordinary developments wheat-growing have been proved possible in various parts of the Canadian Dominion, and just now speculation is rife among the farmers of Quebec as to the chances in this direction held out by the vast new territory lately added to the Province of Quebec. No definite opinion can be pronounced at present as to the total growing capacity of these millions and millions of acres of unsettled land, since only a small part of t the territory has yet been carefully concerned there is sail to be no rea-son why wheat should not be grown in the northernmost limits. Recent experiments have shown that excellent root crops can be grown in some Arctic Circle, and surprising results are constantly being reported.

But so far as climate is | liery officials are required to pass examinations and secure certificates of competency before being allowed to fill responsible positions in and about a colliery. These examinations cover such subjects as scholarship, mine parts of Canada actually within the ventilation, methods of working mines, surveying, geology, mechanics, in respect to the cultivation of wheat I first aid to the injured, etc. For the higher grades of certificates it is necessary that the prospective official shall have a good working knowledge of geometry, algebra, trigonometry, English composition, physics mechanism, geology, mine plans, and surveying, in addition to the specific subjects that relate to practical mine e. loitation. The ambitious miner has usua'ly been required to obtain this knowledge by himself or through the medium f a correspond-

> In Nova Scotla there is an evening technical school for coal miners in seventeen colliery towns, or practica ly every coal-mining community in the province. Four permanent mining instructors and ove; thirty-five ears A husband, two sons, and one part-time teachers are engaged in these schools. The permanent I structors are men who hold the highest certificates of competency and who are engaged in responsible positions in and about the colliery and give a certain number of their evenings to the work of instruction. The classes meet twice a week for a two- ford hour session through a period of eight months of the year. - F. H. Sexton in Industrial Canada

A formation of cells about three inches long and seven inches in thic kness, joins the two babies above the navel.
