HOLSTEIN BREEDERS

HELD ANNUAL MEETING ON FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Lieut.-Col. F. S. Ferguson Was Elected President—There Are Thirty-five Members in the Frontenac Club.

On Friday afternoon the Frontenac Holstein Breeders' Club held its second annual meeting in the Frontenac hotel. This club which was organized last year, and aims at furthering the interests of the breeders of Holstein cattle, and increasing their numbers, has a membership of about thirty-five. Though the club is only in its infancy, its effect is beginning to be felt. There is a large market for Holstein cattle, and breeders are being urged to "indulge" more extensively in their breeding. At the meeting different matters bearing upon this were discussed. A constitution was adopted.

Lieut.-Col. F. S. Ferguson, the commanding officer of the 47th regiment, is the second president of the club. He is one of its most interested and valuable members. He succeeds A. E. Weller, the president of the amalgamated agricultural societies of the township of Kingston and Pittsburg. C. Main, of Sydenham, the district representative of the Ontario department of agriculture, was present at the annual meeting.

The case against George Barr, fishery overseer for the township, of Portland, which was aired in the county court, before Justice of the Peace George Hunter, on December 5th, has been settled by the department, at Toronto. To magistrate decided that Mr. Barr should pay the cost of the court, which amounted to \$4.75.
