FACED GIGANTIC TASK

SIR JAMES MURRAY HAS NEARLY COMPLETED DICTIONARY.

The Man Who Assembled Three Hundred Thousand Words Into a Single Work With All Their Subtle Shades of Meaning is a Scotsman and a Born Lexicographer.

To marshal more than 200,000 words in perfect order, to trace their ancestry, often along the faintest paths of the past and beyond the regions of history, to show how change has left its mark upon them...

Three hundred thousand words. Such is the size and might of the English language - 300,000 main, compound, and subordinate words, made out of the raw material of 25 letters...

And how the two works differ in magnitude! Let me take a couple of instances at random. Under the letter "N" down to the word "niche" Johnson gave 284 words; Sir James Murray gives 3,469.

It was at a time when this veteran was working fifteen hours a day - "harder than I have ever worked in my life before" - that I disturbed him in his little clearing-house of the English language...

And thirty-four years of unremitting labor in this unique workshop has not dimmed the enthusiasm of the great dictionary maker.

Typical Borderer, tall, with heavy nose and white, flowing beard, with the high forehead of a scholar, he recalls almost exactly that other great investigator in a widely different field of human endeavor, Charles Darwin.

Sir James Murray was born in 1827, in the little Border village of Denholm, five miles from Hawick, the birthplace also of John Leyden, friend of Sir Walter Scott, an Orientalist of great genius and a poet of more than ordinary rank.

When he left Hawick in 1854, it was to fill the position of foreign correspondent in the Oriental Bank, London. Six years later he became a master at Mill Hill School.

ENGLAND AND KING MENELIK.

British Government Watching Abyssinia - A Remarkable Career.

Since the death of Menelik England has been looking with anxious eyes upon Abyssinia, for there is considerable disorder in that country. Territory amounting to 8,000 square miles was ceded by the late negus to British Somaliland in 1897.

With little authentic known about the Emperor Menelik, he did enough in his own obscure corner of the world to establish the reputation of being one of the most remarkable men whom the negro race has produced in recent years.

This he accomplished by calling to his aid the science and arts of Europe. He crushed the minor chiefs who opposed him and abolished slavery. He fostered the means of communication and encouraged agriculture.

Jack B., who paints portraits and, incidentally, is the father of William Butler Yeats, the Irish poet, is a regular patron of a certain New York restaurant. Among the habitués of this place he has acquired a reputation as a raconteur.

EARNINGS SMALLER

THE ANNUAL REPORT WILL SHOW A DECREASE

Both Gross and Net Earnings - Calgary Power Shows Good Increase Over 1912.

Montreal, Feb. 18. - Earnings of the Montreal Cotton company for the year ended Dec. 31st will show a considerable decrease from 1912, it is understood. A year ago the company reported total profits of \$294,587, and in 1911 total profits of \$307,743.

4.7 Per Cent. on Stock. Calgary Power Company for the year ended December 31, 1913, were \$240,116, an increase of \$48,270, or 25 per cent. over \$191,846.

The Shareholders. Montreal, Feb. 18. - The 20,000 shares of the City and District Savings Bank, at the end of 1913, were held largely by estates and charitable organizations.

Canada Machinery Corporation. Toronto, Feb. 18. - Bondholders of the Canada Machinery Corporation, limited, representing \$294,000 of the \$595,500 of six per cent. bonds of the corporation, met at Galt and agreed to accept a financial arrangement deferring the bond interest for two years and the commencement of the sinking fund until 1920.

The January Fire Loss. Montreal, Feb. 18. - The losses by fire in the United States and Canada, during the month of January, as compiled by the New York Journal of Commerce and Commercial Bulletin, aggregate \$23,204,700, being an increase of more than three millions over the figures for the first month of 1913.

Good Timing Now. New York, Feb. 18. - The transfer of twelve memberships of the New York Consolidated Stock Exchange within a period of six weeks since Jan. 1st, as against seventeen for the entire year of 1913, would seem to indicate that Wall street "has" come back.

Imperial Tobacco Company. London, Feb. 18. - The Imperial Tobacco Company's report and profits for the year 1913 of \$16,769,560. There was \$1,000,000 carried for reserve, and there was available for dividend \$10,000,000.

Brantford Offer Accepted. Brantford, Feb. 18. - The bondholders of the Grand Valley railway have accepted the offer of the city of Brantford for the street railway. The value of the system was placed at \$253,000, which, while considered by the city officials to be about the value largely on a junk basis, was \$13,000 higher than that made by Mr. Kellett, general manager of the Lake Erie & Northern Railway company.

Made Appointment. London, Feb. 18. - The directorate of the Great Eastern Railway company of England announced the appointment of Henry W. Thornton, general superintendent of the Long Island Railroad, as general manager.

Financial Notes. California's 1913 mineral yield is estimated at \$96,000,000, an increase of \$4,000,000 over 1912. New York Central orders 50,000 tons of rails. Southern Pacific 4,000 tons girder rails. Interboro 5,000 tons rails, and Chicago Northwest 7,500 steel centre sills for car construction.

CLERICS ARE ALARMED. See Danger Ahead if Statements Go Unchallenged. London, Feb. 19. - A memorial signed by 676 priests of the diocese of London was presented to the upper house of convocation yesterday. The memorial expresses grave anxiety as to the consequences, if unrebuked, of the denial of certain fundamental truths of the faith by some who hold office in the church.

The memorialists ask for the repudiation of the claim of some clergy to reject the miracles of Jesus' birth of the virgin and the actual resurrection of His body from the tomb.

In submitting the petition, the bishop of London said he would move at the next session that steps be taken to allay the widespread uneasiness in the church. Books were being published by some of the clergy which seemed to deny the great miracles. In three cases the authors had been removed from or had resigned their offices in the church.

NATIVE CONVICTS ORGANIZE. Cruel Punishment Inflicted in Case of Police Informers. Capetown, Feb. 19. - Astonishing facts were published yesterday by the department of justice showing that native convicts have been binding themselves together for criminal purposes. Their organizations comprise a king, a judge, a fighting general, a medical officer, warriors and younger natives. The organizations hold trials and decree punishments, sentencing to death in some cases by stabbing with sharpened balls through the shoulders, straitjacketing with wet towl, or putting powder in the victim's food.
