TWO DEATHS IN HOME

WITHIN FOUR DAYS OF EACH OTHER

The Stansbury Family Greatly Bereaved—Death of Miss Sarah Grace Stansbury on Saturday.

On Saturday afternoon, death entered the home of Mr. and Mrs. John Stansbury, Reglan Road, for the second time in four days, when their daughter, Miss Sarah Grace, passed to rest after a lingering illness. On Wednesday morning last the first break in the family occurred when their son, George Alexander, passed away. He had been confined to the Hotel Dieu, suffering from typhoid fever.

The late Miss Stansbury was a tailor by trade. She was very popular with her many friends, who were grieved to hear of her passing away. The funeral took place on Monday morning, from her late residence to Cataract cemetery where the remains were placed in the vault, beside those of her brother. The deceased leaves, besides her parents, two brothers and three sisters, Albert and Elsie at home; Mrs. A. Fletcher, of Morley, Alta.; John in Florida and Jennie in Winnipeg.
