LORD KINGSTON VERY HANDY

Once Sent a Burglar to the Hospital for Weeks. Lord Kingston, ninth earl of his line, who has been spending the winter travelling about in the United States and Canada, and is now in New York at the Manhattan hotel, for a stay of some duration, is a peer extremely handy with his fists.

For some years ago, on being awakened in the middle of the night by the presence of a burglar in his bedroom at Kilonran castle, his place in the county of Roscommon, he administered such a vigorous thrashing to the foolish intruder that the man was laid up for several weeks in the hospital for repairs before he was in condition to appear before the magistrates.

Lord Kingston served through the Boer war with the Irish Guards in which he held a commission, and can boast of being that rara avis, a popular Irish landlord, although a Tory, since he believes in and practices the policy of encouraging his tenants to improve their holdings on his 10,000 acres of estates in county Roscommon, not only by means of financial assistance, but also giving them a secure tenure of their farms.

He is very well off, being married to one of the daughters and heiresses of the late Sir Andrew Borely Walker of brewing fame. The estates have been in his family ever since the reign of Queen Elizabeth, who bestowed large grants in Roscommon upon his ancestor, Sir John King, in recognition of his military services.

The earls of Kingston represent, in the female line it is true, the White Knights, and quarter the latter's armorial bearings with their own. Some 1800 years ago John Fitzgerald, lord of Deiles and of Desmond, by virtue of his royal seignory, as palatine of Ireland, created three of his sons by his second marriage hereditary knights, and thus originated the titles of the White Knights, the Knight of Glyn, and the Knight of Kerry.

The title of Knight of Kerry is borne today by Sir Maurice Fitzgerald, owner of Valentia island, on the coast of Kerry, and famous as a yachtsman. The acceptance by his father of baronetcy was very generally condemned in Ireland, where it was argued that a modern dignity of the word inferior to the honor of being 19th hereditary Knight of Kerry.

The present Knight of Glyn is Desmond Fitzgibbon Fitzgerald, son-in-law of the Earl of Dunraven, and there are many here who will recall his wife, Lady Rachel Fitzgerald, as having accompanied her father to America at the time of the Valkyrie races for the America cup. She died some years ago, after giving birth to a son, who will eventually succeed his father as 22nd Knight of Glyn.

The knight of Glyn has no official right, as hereditary knight, to the prefix "Sir" to his Christian name, he refrains from using it, lest it should savor too much of the ordinary knighthood.

The White Knights became extinct in the male line in the reign of Charles I, when their heiress married the first Lord Kingston, and thus brought their property into the Kingston family.

One of the members of Lord Kingston's family has been immortalized by the poet Milton. For it was a son of Sir John King, the founder of his house, whose tragic death, by drowning in the Irish sea, is commemorated by the blind bard in his "Lycidas."

Another member of the family, namely the second Earl of Kingston, was towards the end of the 18th century tried for murder, by the Irish house of lords at Dublin, and promptly acquitted. The drama had originated in the unparadoxical attentions of a Colonel Fitzgerald, a married man, to an unmarried daughter of the earl.

The latter, at that time known as Colonel King, who afterwards became Lord Lorton, resolved to put an end to the matter by challenging Fitzgerald to a duel. The hostile encounter took place in Hyde Park, in London, but was interrupted before much damage had been done, by a great of both combatants, and of their seconds, for "breaking the peace."

Some months later, Colonel King and his father, the earl, found that Colonel Fitzgerald was staying in disguise at an inn, in a village close to their place, at Mitchellstown, near Cork, and that he was making preparations to abduct the girl. Colonel King was engaged in a hand-to-hand encounter with Fitzgerald, in the inn, and was getting the worst of it, when his father, Lord Kingston, rushed in and shot Fitzgerald dead.

Colonel King was tried by the ordinary courts, at Cork, and was acquitted by the jury of the charge of murder, for which he had been indicted. Not long afterwards, his father, Lord Kingston, was tried in the same way, by the Irish house of lords at Dublin, it being the last occasion of the upper house of the Irish legislature sitting as a court of justice upon one of its members. As stated above, Lord Kingston was acquitted by the unanimous vote of his fellow peers.

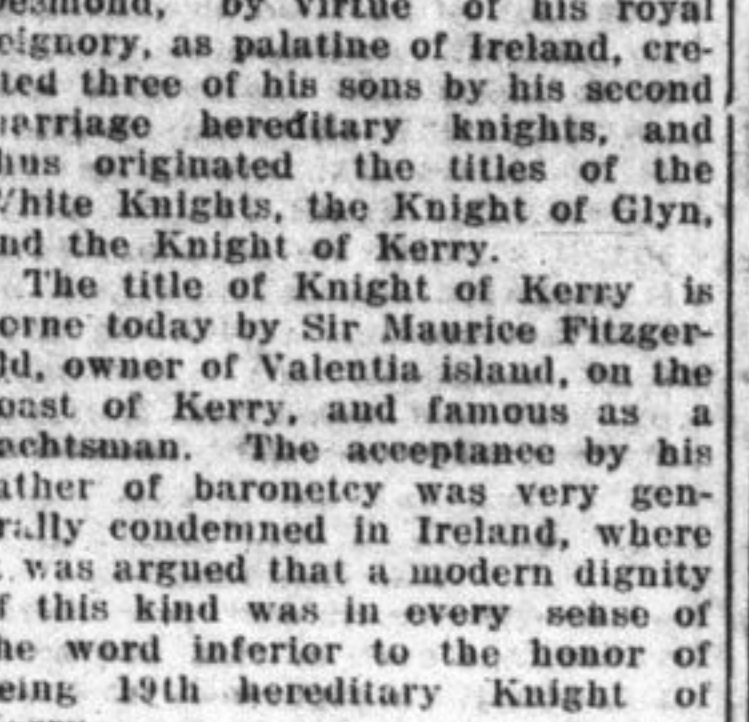
HIT BACK AT VAUGHAN
