In 1870 a punitive expedition was lespatched to the Red River region o put down the Riel rebellion. Riel, lowever, eluded it, but it was sucessful in establishing the authority of the Canadian government in that part of the world. Lord Wolseley (then Colonel Wolseley), was in command of this expedition, and he ilso commanded another expedition on a much larger scale, which was lespatched to Ashantee two years later. The Ashantee king had been harassing British settlers, and Mr. Gladstone's government determined to inflict a blow on him. Accordingly, Lord Wolseley's expedition was despatched. The British defeated the Ashantees everywhere they could get at them, and ultimately forced
