The general feeling, however, was that the regulations in respect to the hours should be reconsidered and a motion was passed that a letter be sent to the senate stating that the Alma Mater was in favor of holding dances until two o'clock.

EDUCATIONAL SUNDAY

N THE QUEEN STREET METHODIST CHURCH

Rev. Basil W. Thompson, of Ottawa, Was the Preacher—Spoke of the Needs of the Canadian Church.

Rev. Basil W. Thompson, M.A., of Trinity church, Ottawa, placed the educational work of Canadian Methodism and its ever-increasing needs before the congregation of Queen Street Methodist church on Sunday.

In the morning his impress centred upon the individual member realizing his and her responsibility to the missionary society's work, and then determining and carrying out their financial obligation.

Intimating that he depended very little upon the contributions of millionaires and wealthy members, the preacher declared that all church enterprises, and the educational in particular, depended upon the generosity of the ordinary circumstances man and woman in the pew.

Mr. Thompson quoted figures and dwelt upon the increase in the number of young men preparing themselves for the Methodist ministry and for this reason the problem which the church of today is faced with.
