RECORD AT THE "PEN"

INTERESTING STATISTICS IN THE ANNUAL REPORT

Sixty Male Convicts Could Not Read or Write — 82 Men in Tolls Over Seventy Years of Age — Work of Female Convicts.

The annual report of the minister of justice as to the penitentiary at Portmouth, gives some interesting information, as well as statistics.

For instance, at the time the report was made out, there were 516 prisoners employed. Out of this number there were sixty males who could not read or write, and two females; there was one male who could read, but not write. There were 444 males and nine females who could read and write.

Under the heading "Social Habits" the prisoners were classified as follows: Temperate, males, 179; females, 5; intemperate, males, 211; female, 3; abstainers, males, 115; female, 3.

These statistics appear under "Civil Conditions": Married, males, 186; females, 7; widowed, males, 8; single, males, 311; females, 4.

Referring to the ages of convicts the report shows six males over seventy years; over sixty and under seventy, 14 males; over fifty and under sixty, males, 34; over forty and under fifty, males 78; females, 2; over thirty and under forty, males, 132; females, 6; over twenty and under thirty, males, 205; females, 3; under twenty, males, 36.

During the year there were fifteen convicts deported, and there were twelve deaths.

The racial statistics showed the following: White, males, 488; females, 10. Colored, males, 15; female, 1. Indian, male, 1.

The punishment of bread and water was administered 168 times; number of convicts involved, 113; number confined in prison of isolation, 15; corporal punishment, per hose, 7; convicts involved, 6; punishment with reduction of rations, males, 14; convicts involved, 10; deprived of writing privilege, 4.

The school instructors' reports showed the total number enrolled during the year was 85; out of this number 35 passed out capable of reading, writing and arithmetic.

The report of the matron stated that everything in connection with the department was in a very satisfactory condition, and that the conduct and industry of the inmates was good.

The female convicts turned out 340 pairs of socks, 1,880 towels, 935 sheets, 453 pillow slips, 81 bed tickets, 449 handkerchiefs, 74 nightshirts, 401 blue striped hospital.

The expenditure is reported as follows: Gross expenditure for 1912-13, \$168,761.25; revenue, \$45,694.81; net expenditure, \$121,076.44.

The cost per capita for three years is given as follows: 1911, \$241.55; 1912, \$242.94; 1913, \$228.24.
