RESCINDS RAILWAY ORDER

ffecting Minimum Carload Weights on Agricultural Products

Ottawa, March 10 .- The railway sued last December suspending the increased minimum carload weight on buckwheat, oats, bran (in bulk), dried beef pulp, oat hulls (in bulk), pea hulls (in bulk), shorts, beets (except sugar), onions, turnips, and potatoes. It is stated in the petition that the closdities mentioned in the foregoing, under the provisions of the Lord's day act, places a hardship upon many residents of the province. It is reported that petitions will also be circulated in a short time requesting the attorney-general to permit the opening of moving picture houses before and after church hours on Sunday.

No Use For Kings Vienna, March 19 .- Samuel Kruty, a young American music pupil, a short time ago attended a concert at Pisik, a small town in Bohemia. During the concert the Austrian national anthem was played, and, as is customary, all the audience rose with the exception of Kruty, who, on being advised to do likewise, responded that as a "free American and a republican" he was not obliged to pay homage to an emperor or a king. He was compelled to leave the hall, and proceedings were afterwards instituted against him by the criminal court of the district, where he was sentenced to three days' imprisonment.
