Will Have 40 H. P. Motor and 300 reet of Hose.

A forty-horse power Buffalo heavy duty engine will be installed to propel her, and a three-inch Rumsey lire nump will be attached to the for-

ward end of the motor. A low deck house will be built over the engine, with a hose reel carrying about 300 feet of hose. The steering wheel and clutch of the engine to the fire pump using as a fire tug, it will be used to haul scows and do other similar work on the water around the property of Mr. Boldt. The tug was designed and is being built under the supervision of Capt. Fred. Adams, the builder of A. G. Miles' new racing hydroplane.
