TO DIE UNJUSTLY

MEAN ABOUT TO DIE ISSUE A STATEMENT.

Gunmen Protest Against Being Executed While Becker Gets New Trial — Total of Innocence.

New York, March 23.—Convicted of the murder of Herman Rosenthal and sentenced to die in the electric chair in the week beginning April 13th, the four gunmen in the Sing Sing death house issued a statement "to the public." Alleging that they were left to die unjustly, while former convict Charles Becker obtained a new trial, they had their counsel, Charles G. Walsh, give out their appeal for "justice" and "fair play," which they had already prepared when he visited them yesterday. They reiterated their innocence, and charge Harry Vallon and "Beagle" Webber with the Rosenthal murder.

"Levy Louis" Rosenberg, twenty-two, the youngest of the four, wrote the statement, and it was signed by the others through the heavy bars of their cells as the guard held it for them.

"Dago Frank" Crofci added a statement of his own, controverting a particular point in the opinion of the court of appeals. The others who signed the document are Frank Muller, otherwise "Whitely Lewis," and "Gyp the Blood," whose name is Harry Horowitz.

PRINCIPAL EXONERATED

Of Charge of Reflecting on Roman Catholic Clergy
Walkerville, March 23.—The auditorium of King Edward public school in Walkerville was crowded with interested citizens last night when the new assessor, Principal H. A. Beaton, charged with having made certain derogatory statements to his pupils regarding the Roman Catholic clergy, was called. The entire board of trustees of Walkerville public schools, with Chairman Edward F. Ladore, heard the testimony of about twenty-five witnesses, most of them pupils in King Edward school, and at the conclusion of the examination unanimously adopted a resolution of confidence in Principal Beaton, and exonerated him completely from the charges and allegations made against him.

\$5,000 BREAD AND CHEESE

London Parish Confronted With Curious Situation
London, March 24.—On going through their records the trustees of the Paddington charities discovered that in order to dispense one of their oldest charities, according to the exact terms of the bequest, it would be necessary to throw to the poor from Paddington church's steppe \$5,000 worth of bread and cheese. The bequest, which dates from Tudor times, enjoined that the rent derived from a certain piece of land should be distributed in this way. The annual rent at that time was only \$10 or \$15. Now it is \$5,000 a year. The bequest is said to have been made by the mother of Henry VIII.

Kingston Will Help

That the Kingston, Ont., Chamber of Commerce will probably co-operate with the local chamber in securing the steamer Olcott for the Oswego-Kingston route was the substance of a letter received by Manager Macleay, of the development bureau of the Chamber of Commerce, from Secretary Macne, of the Kingston organization. Mr. Macne says that the matter has been placed in the hands of the advisory council of the Kingston board, and that favorable action on the proposition is expected.

Fire Broke Out Monday Afternoon in the Scott Block, Winnipeg, valued at \$15,000, and carrying insurance of \$55,000. The whole interior of the building was wrecked.

Douglas W. Wright, of Gunn's, Limited, Toronto, was appointed manager of the civic abattoir at a salary of \$2,750 a year, by the city council. The minister of finance will deliver his budget speech on March 30th.
