Famous Cedars Disappear

According to a French traveller who has just returned from Syria, the celebrated "cedars of Lebanon," so often spoken of in the Old Testament, are disappearing at a rate that will soon make them a mere Biblical legend. Mountain slopes formerly covered with them are now completely denuded, with the exception of those of the Jebel-el-Arz, where about 400 trees are still standing. In this group there are some fine specimens of cedars, the oldest having a height of 89 feet, whilst the largest at the base of the trunk has a circumference of 49 feet. It is estimated that these venerable trees are over a thousand years old. As a protection, a high wall has now been erected around this grove by the local authorities.

Substitute for Meat

In Europe, where the problem of securing sufficient food is more pressing than in America, long strides are being made by the chemists in their efforts to produce food by artificial means. A Belgian chemist named Mignot, has devised a means of transforming spent yeast and other waste food products into what is described to be a satisfactory substitute for meat. He has named this artificial meat "viandine," and it is described as very similar to flesh, but much less expensive.
