(THE STORY)

Jesus' journey took the nature of a triumph. Incredible multitudes were attracted by His miracles. Curiosity waxed. His name was on every The motives of His followers were asturally mixed. There was a curiosity which itched, like that of Athens, to hear some new thing. Then there was always the sordid element, which had eyes only for the loaves and fishes. There were ambitious spirits, too, who heped to mount to power in the new kingdom. There were those who had a private grudge against some Roman or publican, which they hoped to satisfy when the yoke was broken. There were patriots, who believed Israel's deliverance at hand. This motley crowd must be shaken in a wide-mesh sleve, in order that those who bulk large in sincerity may be screened out. The words of Jesus in this instance make such a sleve. They are a challenge in hyperbole. If any imagined the following of Jesus an easy junketing-affair, they were pretty roughly joited out of the notion.

Even natural affection must not stand in the way. All the sweet pleasures that cluster about the hearthstone must, if need, he the forfelt. There must be martyr-stuff in every recruit. He must not merely see his Master erucified, but must bear his own cross, and in that day that meant to have the hangman's noose fitted about his own neck. It is as if the Master were saying, "This is the cost! Come now; count

No munitions or provisions, only forced marches, and struggle of bayonet against batteries. Let only those who love Freedom follow!"

THE TEACHER'S LANTERN It is affection which incites Jesus to paint the picture of discipleship in most somber colors possible. He pities those who follow Him inconsiderately, knowing how bitterly they will be disappointed. Again, those who are not daunted by words so appalling are doubly tried and so doubly true. . . Then, too, Jesus feels His bounden duty to conserve the cause He has inaugurated. For this reason He puts the price of discipleship at the highest notch. His kingdom is safer in the hands of a small company of thoroughly-tested disciples than in a host of superficial, half-baked followers. . Jesus may have had in mind the Tower of Babel, the most gigantic, ill-considered building-enterprise

of man, whose very name means confusion, a synonym of failure. These rigorous words are just as applicable to the continuance and completion as to the beginning of discipleship. . Two signs mark the true disciple. He does not begin until all is weighed. He does not cease until all is accomplished. . . It has been aptly said that it is easier to throw away the life than to live it Christianly.

> "Of late the country has been a turmoll of civil strife and frontier trouples, and scarcely a day has passed without some military operations. Aiter your excellency suppressed the internal troubles and made peaceful settlements with the powers, the first thing that attracted your attention with the financial administration. Foreign loans have been resorted to, to relieve the country's financial em barrassment, but owing to the fact that the terms of the foreign syndicates were too harsh, some patriotic people have suggested ways of col lecting taxes while others proposen a retrenchment policy. But all these pecious words and theories can do real good to the country.

OFFENCE NOT EXTRADITABLE

Cannot be Brought Back to U. S. if Conviction is Upheld

Chicago, April 15 .- Decisions in the dynamite conspiracy and "Jack" Johnson cases will be handed down to-day by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, it is expected Jack Johnson was found guilty of transporting Belle Schreiber, white woman, from Pittsburg to Chicago for immoral purposes and sentenced to a year and a day in the penitentiary and fined \$1,000. Pending appeal Johnson was released on bail. He fled the country going to Europe by way of Canada. If the conviction is upheld. Johnson, it is said, cannot be brought back to the United States, as a violation of the Mann act is not an extraditable offence.
