Supposedly Funeral Party Opened

Fire on Soldiers. Vera Cruz, April 28.-Firing took place in a cemetery outside of Vera Cruz city limits, where for two days there had been much sharp-shooting at the United States forces from the direction of the cemetery.

An investigation was made by detachment of the battalion of bluejackets from the battleship Michigan, which was on outpost duty. The attention of the officer in com-

mand was drawn to what purported hall to be a funeral party escorting a hody for burial in the cemetery. Close investigation revealed that the coffin, instead of containing corpse, was filled with rifles and am

This discovery confirmed the Am ericans' suspicion. The blueiackets then continued their search in cemetery and came upon a newlydug grave, in and around which was a body of Armed Mexicans. A brief encounter followed and

bluejackets killed four Mexicans, who were concealed in the open grave, and wounded several others.

It is supposed that under the pre text of conducting funerals the Mexicans were preparing to dig supposed graves, which were to serve as entrenchments. All the sharp-shooting which came from the cemetery was from the direction of the grave where the Mexicans were afterward found.
