Principal Sliter Presented Report on the Attendance.

Principal E. O. Sliter presented to the Board of Education a report of the attendance at the industrial classes. At the dress-making classes there were enrolled 94 women, with an average weekly attendance of 41. At the millinery classes there were sixty-five with an average attendance of thirty-one. Sixty women and girls received the benefit of the classes.

Principal Sliter recommended that the classes be opened not earlier than Oct. 15th, and close on Dec. 15th. He also recommended that all the classes be at the Collegiate Institute, so as to be under the control of the management committee will deal with the report.

Principal Sliter, regarded the class as a great success and so did Chairman Macene and members of the board.
