Two Drown From Overturned Canoe, While Thrift, a Woman Jumps to Her Death With Rope Around Her Neck.

Watertown, N.Y., June 2.—The body of Frank Denning, East Watertown, one of the three victims claimed by the Black river, yesterday, was recovered. The bodies of the others, Lyla Curtis, grandson of the man, and Mrs. Sarah Miller, of Dexter, who is said to have committed suicide, were recovered about noon.

Denning, his grandson and Sennet Greene, at whose home they were staying, were out rowing. They had gone to a nearby market to purchase meat for dinner. The boat was leaky, and one of the men leaped overboard to pick up the package. In doing so the boat tipped over and the three fell in. Greene was saved by Hungarian track laborers, who heard the screams.

Denning grabbed the child when the boat overturned, and Greene grasped the boat with one hand and leaning with the other. Greene, who is about sixty years old, lost his grasp and when dragged out was exhausted. A search was started immediately, but only the body of the boy was found.

Mrs. Miller was first missed from her home on Monday morning, when her husband awoke and failed to find her. She had been ill for some time and it is believed her mind was affected.

As soon as she was missed the water near the house was searched, but no trace of the body was found until noon, when a daughter discovered a rope hanging from the dock. The body of the woman was discovered at the other end of the rope.

The Millers are well known here, where they live until a short time ago. Mr. Miller was employed in the New York air brake plant.

### C.N.R. Guarantee Resolution

Ottawa, June 2.—The government gave notice of a resolution late last evening, which will be moved in the house, to guarantee the bonds of the Great North Pacific railway, to the extent of three-quarters of the cost of the completion of the mountain section of the line. This will amount to \$16,000,000. The estimate of the company is that it will take about \$20,000,000 to complete the section, but there is interest also to be provided for.

For this the government accepts as security a mortgage on the western division and on the Lake Superior branch subject to all existing prior mortgages thereon.

### Widow Receives Bulk.

The McVicar will case came to a sudden stop in the non-jury assizes in Toronto before Chief Justice H. M. Meredith, when the plaintiffs, eleven nieces and nephews of the late George McVicar, the Port Arthur millionaire, withdrew their case. The final settlement has not yet been completed, but the widow of the late millionaire will receive approximately \$750,000 as her share and as provided for in the will.

His widow was Miss Finn, formerly of Newburgh.

### New Teacher Appointed

At a meeting of the management committee of the Board of Education a number of appointments on the teaching staff and other changes were arranged for. The recommendations will be considered at the next meeting of the board.

The Kingston delegation of the Anglican Women's Auxiliary left at noon on Tuesday to attend the conference which meets in Brockville. Some forty members went on this delegation and will remain there until Friday.

The crisis in the mediation proceedings between Mexico and the United States is at an acute stage. The three South American diplomats and the American delegates have reached an absolute deadlock.

# HINDUS THREATEN TROUBLE

First Appeal to Home Officials to Influence Canadian Government.

Vancouver, June 2.—That the Marajahs of two of the most important Indian provinces be requested to call on the viceroy to demand in return that he shall appeal to the imperial government and to the government of Canada to secure entry for the Hindus aboard the Komagata Maru, now in this port, was a resolution passed at a meeting of East Indians, when heavy subscriptions were made for their brethren on board the steamer. The threat was added that if such unrest would be fomented in India if the party are not allowed to land.

The situation has become rather aggravated because 640 Chinese arrived on the Empress of Russia Saturday and were admitted on payment of \$500 head tax each. Boards of inquiry in the individual cases of the Hindus convened to-day, and will probably last all week.
