Continuing, his honor stated that he would consider the request of the jury that he show mercy. However, the case was of such a serious pa ture that he could not give him his liberty. Had it been a case of the theft of only \$2 it would have been a different thing. But there was far more serious charge to answer for. Had the jury not found the accused guilty he would have regarded the verdict as a miscarriage justice and would have preferred charges of forgery and perjury the prisoner.


