CHAINS USED FOR YEARS

Device One Time Part of Watches Now on Automobiles

The possibilities of the silent chain, now being used on a great many of the higher priced cars, have only been fully realized within the last few years. It is not a mechanical device, but in fact a very old one, as it is now known to have been used seven hundred years ago. Its first use, according to any definite information, was in the manufacture of Swiss watches, as a compensating feature, the idea being to compensate for the change of tension, as the spring retarded and gradually became weaker. This was done with the aid of a conical constructed wheel to retain the same initial tension and torsion in the chain, thereby assuring perfect regulation.

It has also been used to great advantage in power transmission work. This application of the chain as first patented by a clerk in the Bank of England in 1865, it having the arched link.

Prof. John R. Allen of the University of Michigan is also using an adaptation of this chain advantageously in a large power plant in the west to transmit 5,000 horsepower from water turbines to electric generators. There are eight chains, twenty-four feet long, twenty-two inches wide and weighing 22,000 pounds and revolving at 225 revolutions per minute.

Naon Is Persuasive.

Dr. Romulo S. Naon, the Minister of Argentine, which is the "A" of the so-called "A.B.C." republics, which figure in the Mexican plan at Niagara Falls, is a persuasive person. It is said to have been he who talked T. Roosevelt into making his recent trip to South America.

One person after another interested in South America went to Roosevelt and tried to show him what a great thing it would be for science, humanity, and himself, if he would make a trip over the continent and get acquainted with the people. But T. R. seemed reluctant to make the journey. Then Naon got hold of Roosevelt and told him that he, T. R., had a message for the South American people that, whatever it was, they wanted to hear. He stated the thing with such suavity and exhibited such an engaging personality, that almost immediately after the interview, Roosevelt determined to make the trip.

Naon is really the Roosevelt of Argentina—that is, he represents the extreme progressive thought of that country.

THE DEMAND MADE.

Thousand Islands Hotels Must Have Fire Escapes.

Thousand Island hotels will not be permitted to open for business this month unless they are fully equipped with fire escapes. Such was the statement made by Edward Henneberry, of the United States state fire marshal's office, who left for the islands, where he will spend the next two days in making an examination of the hotels. Proprietors were notified a year ago that they must comply with the fire regulations. In nearly every case the buildings have been properly equipped.

The hotels at Alexandria Bay open this week, while those at Thousand Island Park, Clayton, St. Lawrence Park and the other resorts along the river will open within a few days. Mr. Henneberry said that while he had not visited the region in the last six weeks that he had received word that the hotel proprietors were busily engaged in getting the fire escapes on their places and that he expected no trouble on his present trip.

"There have been so many fires at the islands that summer guests will be apt to look first to see that the building housing them has all the necessary fire escapes," said Mr. Henneberry, "and I think the proprietors recognize that any further delay means a loss of business that they cannot afford to stand."
