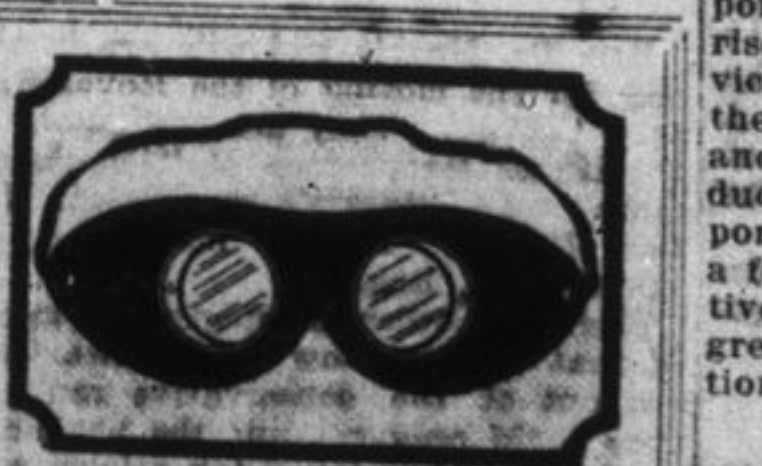

A fine of \$10 and costs of twenty days was imposed on Bryon.

On Monday afternoon, June 22nd, Mrs. Sullivan, wife of ex-Senator M. Sullivan, of this city, died after a very brief illness.

The late Mrs. Sullivan's family rose in her a devoted wife and tender mother, while her unostentatious benevolence and wide sympathy won for her in every class true and devoted friends, who will long hold her in their hearts as a noble type of Christian womanhood.

In religion Mrs. Sullivan was a Roman Catholic and a prominent member of the various charitable organizations of her church. She was honorary president of both the Orphan's Guild of the House of Providence and of the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Hotel Dieu.

Her husband, a son, W. H. Sullivan, of St. Catharines, and two daughters, Mrs. C. J. Crookall, of Bay Ridge, N.Y., and Miss Frances, of this city, are left to mourn her loss.

The funeral will proceed to St. Mary's cathedral on Wednesday morning at 9:30 o'clock and a solemn requiem mass will be sung by the repose of her soul. The remains will be buried in St. Mary's cemetery.
