The work on the new car track on Princess street is progressing rapidly. M. Lowry and his men, on Wednesday morning, began the laying of steel for the other track at the corner of Clergy street, and laid it as far as the opera house on Wednesday.

**POSITION OF THE EMPRESS**  
On River Bed is Northeast and Southwest.

Quebec, June 24.—This morning was told the story of the Empress of Ireland as she lies on the bottom of the river. Wilfrid Whitehead told his story simply. He had gone down to find out which direction the ship was lying. He descended on the side of the vessel, left at her plates to determine the direction of her stem, and then walked along her forward.

By this means, air bubbles rising from him, would tell the officer above which way the vessel was lying. This direction, chief Gunner Altheim had informed the court, was north-east and south-west.

**ROCKFELLER AIDS FUNDS**  
Sends \$11,000 to Swell Disaster Collection

London, June 24.—According to the Daily Mail, John D. Rockefeller has sent Miss Eva Booth, commander of the Salvation Army, in America, a check for \$11,000 for the fund that is being raised for the sufferers of the Empress of Ireland disaster. Miss Booth is here attending the World's Congress of the Salvation Army.

**REMARKABLE SPECTACLE.**  
Striking French Mail Clerks Barricaded in Postoffice.

Paris, June 24.—The extraordinary spectacle of mutinous striking mail clerks, barricaded in the post office department, and building surrounded by gendarmes, vainly trying to secure admittance, was continued in this city to-day. The government continues to belittle the strike but the mails of France are practically held up by the strike.

**New York Chinaman Fined.**  
Watertown, N.Y., June 24.—Lee Sam, or Lee Woy, of New York, who pleaded guilty to smuggling Chinamen into America across the border from Prescott in Rockville, whence he took them to New York by automobile, under cover of darkness, was fined \$1,800 by Judge George W. Ray in United States court here.

His accomplices, among them Jud Clark, a Ulica hotel proprietor, who turned state's evidence, were given suspended sentences until next term of court.

**Tornado in Minnesota.**  
St. Paul, Minn., June 24.—Two persons dead, several missing and thousands of dollars damage was result as gleaned from the wires to-day from various parts of the state, as a result of the tornado which swept this section last night. At first it was stated there were hundreds dead.

**Bishop Dunn to Resign.**  
Quebec, June 24.—The impending resignation from the Episcopal seat of the Anglican diocese of Quebec of the Right Rev. Andrew Hunter Dunn, after twenty-two years of labor, was announced by the bishop himself to-day at Bishop's college. Lennoxville. His resignation is to take effect November 1st.

**Scotch Peer Takes Life.**  
London, June 24.—Lord Forbes, the premier Scottish baron, who has been a representative peer for Scotland since 1874, was found with his throat cut at an hotel in Dundee, where he had been staying for a month. No details of the affair have been received.

**Died in Brandon.**  
Brandon, Man., June 24.—Samuel Henry Bowey, aged sixty-eight, an ex-alderman of this city, died Tuesday morning. He lived in Brandon for thirty-four years, coming here from Kempville, Ont.

TO WED AMERICAN GIRL.

Miss Havemeyer Engaged to Earl of Euston.

London, June 24.—Considerable interest has been aroused by the announcement of the engagement of the Earl of Euston, the eldest surviving son of the Duke of Grafton and Miss Edythe Havemeyer, youngest daughter of the late Henry Havemeyer, of New York. Prior to the announcement, Miss Havemeyer went to the country and her present whereabouts are kept secret. She is reputed to have a personal fortune of between \$5,000,000 and \$7,500,000.

Lord Euston has a son, Viscount Ipswich, who was married last year, and two daughters. He is a Fitz Roy and the blood of the Stuart kings runs in his veins. The dukedom of Grafton was bestowed by Charles the Second on one of his numerous progeny, the son of the beautiful Barbara Villers. Lord Euston, who has not played prominent part in public, derived his courtesy title from a village in Suffolk, near which is Euston Hall, the principal country seat of the Fitz Roy family. Through his mother, the late Duchess, who died over 54 years ago, the Earl's closely connected with the Balfours of Whittingham, the great Scottish family of which the Right Honorable Arthur J. Balfour, is the foremost representative.

Louis Malette, baker, Brockville, died on Tuesday after two months illness with pleurisy. He was forty-two years of age. A widow and seven small children survive.
