The annual farewell dinner of the graduates of the Royal Military college took place on Thursday evening, and was a jolly affair.

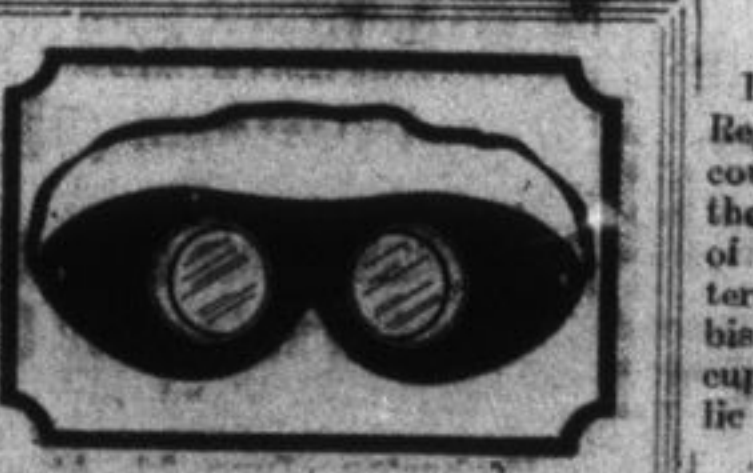
Weather Notes.

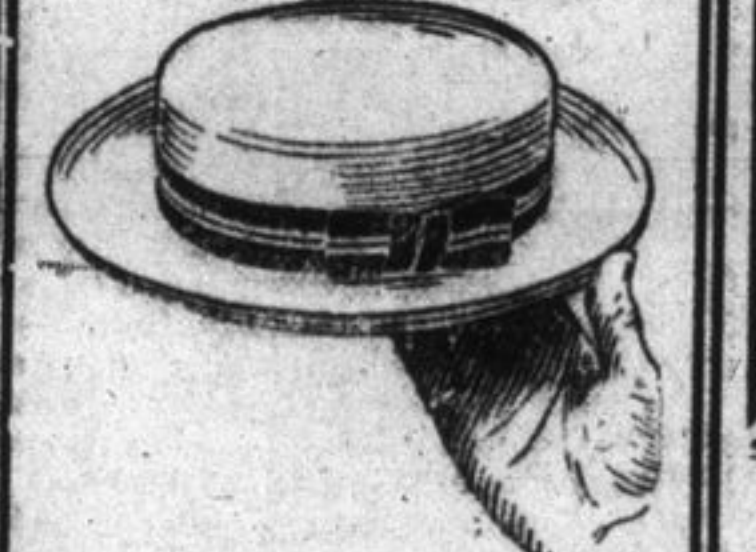
