STUDY OF THE MOON.

Prof. W. E. Brown of Yale, Has Made a Discovery.

There was once a fantastic speculation that the other, the unseen side of the moon, might, on account of the sphere's lopsidedness, be the receptacle of a lunar ocean. That is quite impossible, but there is a lopsidedness of the moon of another kind.

Among the minor irregularities of its motion is one which makes the plane of its orbit south of that in which it ought to move, or, in the astronomical phrase, the mean latitude of the moon is not quite zero.

Franz, from observations of the photographs in his map of the moon, came to the conclusion that the northern half of the moon had an elevation which was generally low compared with that of the southern hemisphere.

Professor W. E. Brown of Yale finds that the irregularities in the moon's motion in the plane of its orbit can be reconciled with this assumption. It thus appears that the conformation of the moon reverses that of the earth, on which the Antarctic Continent discovered by recent exploration is excepted, the northern half of the planet has the higher elevation. The fact is interesting to geologists.

According to the theory now most in fashion the general arrangement of the land masses on the globe is one of the compensating balance. The continental plateaus are of light material, the mountains and their foundations lighter still, and the heavier, denser materials are the beds of the oceans. The lighter material has been floated up on top of the heavier, and the depth of this compensation extends to between 70 and 80 miles in the earth's crust. How this condition came about in the surface layers of a cooling and rotating planet is not quite clear.

One of the plausible explanations is that the action of rain and running water, intensified by differences to be intensified later. On the moon there is no surface water, and probably never was.

We can only assume that the density of the material in the northern half of the moon, which is probably that of its shell or crust rather than its nucleus, is greater than that of the southern half with its raised table lands.—London Post.

TO MAKE IT AN OFFENCE

To Throw Waste Paper on Streets of Montreal.

Mayor Martin stated yesterday that he would soon begin a campaign for preventing the littering of streets with waste papers of all descriptions.

"I will ask the board of control," he explained, "in a day or two to vote funds for 1,000 wire baskets which will be placed at street corners and then we will instruct the police to notify the public where to throw their paper bags and old newspapers, and those who don't comply will be liable to arrest."

As the city is spending two millions and a half a year on street pavements and sidewalks, Mayor Martin declared the time had come to stop the clouds of papers that were flying about and the only way to do it was to show the public the easier way of disposing of waste material in the wire baskets which will be put at convenient points.

This system of police enforcing such a by-law will be a novelty in Montreal. For example, when leaving a theatre or picture show it is quite a common thing to see programmes thrown on the streets. These will have to be picked up and put in the baskets as well as the banana and orange peels, not to mention the cast off newspapers and wrapping papers which gusts of wind land in the city parks and front yards of fine residences.

"We will begin with 1,000 baskets," said Mayor Martin. "It will make a good beginning."

Steel Wheels Are Strongest.

In experiments to determine the relative strength of wire, wood and steel wheels, recently conducted on the Riche testing machine at the University of Michigan, the steel wheel proved the strongest.

This type did not fall under a lateral pressure of 3340 pounds, to the square inch, whereas the wood wheel collapsed at 4500 pounds and two spokes in the wire wheel broke at 4000 pounds. In the latter test, however, nipples pulled through the rim.—American Mechanist.
