

BY CITY COUNCIL ON THE LEON-ARD PROPOSITION.

The Side of Queen's Authorities First to be Heard-The Matter Left in the Mayor's Hands.

Just before the City Council adjourned after midnight Monday, Mayor Shaw spoke of his conference last week with Major R. W. Leonard, with regard to his military residence offer to Queen's university, which had been withdrawn after the university authorities had persisted in being given the majority of members on the board of control. His worship stated that Major Leonard was not unwilling to have the matter reopened, and he (the mayor) suggested that the council should try and act as mediator and have the university authorities again take up the proposition of Major Leonard, which,

would mean so much for Kingston. Ald. Kent had a resolution prepared to authorize the Finance Committee to take up the matter with Queen's, but it was pointed out by one or two aldermen that there were two-sides to the question, and that before the council took any action; the view of the Queen's board of trustees should be ascertained. The matter' was left in the hands of the mayer, who will make the necessary enquir-
