

Twenty Foreigners Asleep in It at the Time.

The men who occupy the shed were sound asleep at the time and as a result they received a byld fright. In the room where the fire was first noticed nineteen men were asleep in their

One of them happened to awake and noticed the blaze in the corner of the room, where the electric wires enter the building. The men were forced to take what bed clothing was not burned and sleep in the grass. The loss was about \$450.
