King Albert is the second son of he Count of Flanders, who was the younger brother of Leopold. Albert's elder brother died, and as Leopold had no son, he became the heir to the throne, as women are debarred under the Belgian laws. On the death of his father, several years ago, Albert inherited a large fortune. The King's full name is Albert

Leopold Clement Maria Mainrad. His mother was the Princess Maria of Hohenzollern, and he was born April 8th, 1875, His paternal grandmother was a daughter of Louis Philippe, King of France. He is finely ed cated, and is thoroughly unostentatious. Stubborness of purpose is the chief characteristic he inherited from his Hohenzollern mother.

He is fond of athletics, and because of this has changed a naturally delicate constitution into one much more robust.
