In the recent Balkan wars about 350,000 men were killed, though both the area and the countries concerned were insignificant in comparison with those of the present war. At Waterloo the loss to Wellington was about 20,000 men. At Liege, one of the preliminary skirmishes of the present war, the Germans lost, according to reliable and confirmed statements, about 25,000 men and the Belgians 8,000 or 10,000.

It is interesting to note that the loss in killed and wounded to Germany in the war of 1870-71 was only 129,000. In the frontier preliminaries in Belgium the Germans have lost about a fourth as many as in the whole campaign against Napoleon III. What their losses will be when the masses of the French and Russian armies come into conflict with the German millions the imagination fails to grasp.
