A Sketch of the Late Roman Catholic Pontiff Who Died in the Vatican on Wednesday--He Was "A Compromise Pope."

Pope Pius was a son of the people. His father, Giovanni Sarto, earned forty cents a day as a postman, and his wife supplemented this slender income by making dresses. So scanty were the means of the family that the six sisters of the boy, who was designed to be the greatest religious figure in the world were not educated, and never learned to read or write, even in after life. The thing for which Pope Pius was most loved was the tender care with which he watched after the welfare of his mother and sisters when he became able to help. He sent nearly all the money which he did not give to charities of the soul, attract one most of all. They are large and singularly beautiful and luminous. Always the light of kindness and benevolence shines through them, and there is a merry twinkle in them sometimes.

by eyes in which is the light of seemingly perpetual youth, reminding the observer of Pius IX, whom he also resembles in his candid, unassuming expression, brightened by a twinkling humor about the lips.

Yet there was no weakness in his nature, and his own consuming energy was only equalled by the work he compelled from the priests under his direction. Above all, he preached the gospel of personal culture, and put cleanliness next to godliness and good manners next to good morals, setting an example in these things by his own refinement and old-fashioned courtesy of manner. So much did he recognize the duty of that true gentility which reveals itself in speech as well as in deed, that he issued a "Manual of Politeness" for the use of his young clergy.

ISLAND FARMERS PLEASED

Prince Edward Island Crops Are Excellent.

Charlottetown, P.E.I., Aug. 20.—Prince Edward Island crops are excellent, and notwithstanding the late season, with good weather conditions at harvest time, island farmers will produce their share of the dominion's export of foodstuffs. In Cornwall and from there to Crapaud, along the south shore, the crops are making fine progress. W. Davidson of the department of agriculture, who spent some time recently in the southern part of the island, reports that having is in full operation, and that the hay is of the finest. The clover fields are reported in excellent condition. The effects of the war are being felt by the absence of the young men called away, the loss of which is having quite an effect on the labor conditions throughout the farming districts.

ZEPPELIN'S DESTROYED

One Other Fell Into Forest and Was Wrecked.

London, Aug. 20.—A Paris despatch to the Exchange Telegraph company says: "Paul Doumer, former French minister of finance, who has just returned from the fighting line in Belgium, says that three Zeppelin dirigibles, which were reconnoitering over the war zone, were destroyed and one fell into a forest and was wrecked.

Found Dead In Bed.

Belleville, Aug. 20.—Francis Drake, an unmarried man, who has resided in this city for many years, was on Tuesday found dead in his apartment. Apoplexy was the cause of death. He was sixty-five years of age and had no relatives here. A sister, Mrs. A. Cartwright, resides in Toronto.

Aged Widow Ended Life.

London, Ont., Aug. 20.—In a fit of despondency Mrs. Margaret McIntyre, a widow aged seventy-three, threw herself from a second-story window of a rooming house at 338 Mallard street, and was almost instantly killed.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

GIVES WARNING TO CUBA.

Britain Will Not Tolerate Provisioning German Cruisers.

Havana, Aug. 20.—Denys Cowan, the British Charge d'Affaires, practically has warned Cuba, against allowing German warships to provision at Cuban ports, as it is understood the cruiser Karlsruhe has been doing through German merchantmen. Ships put into Havana and afterwards discharged their cargo of provisions to the Karlsruhe at sea.

Change Par Value Shares.

Toronto, Aug. 19.—Notices have been sent to the holders of preferred shares of Penmans Limited, announcing that at a special meeting of the directors, held several weeks ago, it was decided to change the par value of the company's preferred stock from five dollars to a hundred and requesting preferred shareholders to forthwith deposit their certificates with the Royal Trust company for transfer to the new scrip.

CHAOS AT PORT SAID.

Colossal Fleet of German Ships Under Seizure.

Milan, Aug. 20.—A cable despatch received here from Port Said says: "There is an unprecedented state of affairs here through traffic in the Suez canal having practically ceased. The port is crammed with ships of all nations. Captains are afraid to proceed.

Wilson Brokerage Co., Suspends.

San Francisco, Aug. 19.—J. C. Wilson & Co., members of the New York Stock Exchange, the New York Cotton Exchange, the Chicago Board of Trade and the San Francisco Stock and Bond Exchange, announced here that the firm had decided to go into voluntary bankruptcy.

Found Rich "Present"

City Engineer of Montreal Returned Bills to Company.

Montreal, Aug. 20.—An interesting story detailing how he found two \$1000 Dominion of Canada bills in a Christmas box of cigars which lay in his cellar for two months before it was opened was told to the board of control by George Jania, chief city engineer, at the resumption of the investigation into the Notre Dame de Grace sewer contract scandal.

WORKMAN ELECTROCUTED

Cover of Cinder Machine Became Charged.

Belleville, Aug. 20.—Frederick Tuttle, an employee of the cement works at Point Ann, met death by electrocution while operating a cinder machine which is covered with galvanized iron. An electric motor runs the machine and in some manner the electric wiring came into contact with the covering. Tuttle was standing upon the damp ground when he touched the sheeting, receiving a shock which caused instant death. An inquest will be held. A wife and five children survive.

PRINCE A DESERTER.

Quits Austrian Army to Volunteer to Serve France.

Basle, Switzerland, Aug. 20.—Prince Antoine of Orleans is a deserter. He is an officer in the 9th Hussars, a crack cavalry regiment of the Austrian army, but yesterday succeeded in crossing the border into Bernese. He is anxious to fight for his own country and has offered his services as a private soldier to France. He is now waiting at Bernese for a reply from President Poincare.

GARIBALDI'S OFFER.

France Thanks Him for Tender of 20,000 Italians.

Paris, Aug. 20.—M. Messimy, the minister of war, sent a letter to Ricotte Garibaldi, son of the Italian liberator, thanking him for his offer to furnish 20,000 Italians to fight for the French. He added, however, that he would not for the moment be able to accept the offer.

Slatin Pasha Resigns.

London, Aug. 20.—A despatch to Reuter's agency from Berlin by way of Amsterdam says: "Slatin Pasha, British Inspector-general in the Sudan and an honorary major-general in the British army has resigned his Sudan post in consequence of Great Britain's declaration of war against Austria, in which country he was born in 1837 and in which he was made baron in 1906."

More At War Than At Peace.

Of all the people on earth more are at war to-day than are following the paths of peace. The world has fifty-three independent governments or nations under their own rule, eight of these—England, Russia, Germany, France, Austria, Belgium, Serbia and Montenegro—are now at war, involving their combined population of 837,417,000. The forty-five nations at peace have only 682,733,000 population. Should Japan become involved, the war element would be increased by 97,132,900.
