CHOKED WITH SLAIN

TRODDEN DOWN IN FLIGHT UNTIL WATERS WERE DAMMED.

Made Banks Overflow—Hundreds of Acres Of The Austrian Soil Sown With Bodies.

London, Sept. 18.—The newspaper correspondents describing the scenes on the battlefields abandoned by the Austro-German forces last week...

They were choked full with slain men, trodden down in the headlong flight till the waters were dammed and overflowing the banks.

Hundreds of acres are sown with bodies and littered with weapons and battle debris.

The troops captured comprise much German equipment. An ammunition train captured at Janow 11 German, while the guns taken include thirty-six of heavy calibre and belonging to the German sixth army corps.

The line of retreat of the Austro-German forces was blocked with debris of every kind—valuable military supplies, telephones and telegraph installations, light railway and other stores, building material.

In fact, everything needed by a modern army was flung away in flight.

Over 1,000 waggons with commissariat supplies alone were captured.

The Bourse Gazette, which is apparently inspired, declares that Russia will enter into no peace negotiations, direct or indirect, until Prussian militarism is completely crushed.

GERMAN NAVAL BLUNDER.

Ships Fired On Each Other in Baltic.

London, Sept. 18.—Telegraphing to the Times, its Petrograd correspondent says: "Reports of disaster to the German fleet in the Baltic have been confirmed by dispatches received here which declare that German warships fired upon each other. All rumors of engagements with the Russian fleet in the Baltic, however, are untrue."

The information reaching Petrograd is that a numerous flotilla, attended by cruisers, while engaged in hunting down passenger steamers, mistook their own for the enemy's ships and engaged in a lively battle.

The number of vessels crippled is unknown, but several cruisers entered Kiel badly mauled and riddled and carrying many wounded.
