WAS FOUND AGAINST DR. C. B ROBINSON.

By Grand Jury at Napance Assizes -The Case Goes Over Till the Spring Assizes.

Napanee, Sept. 24.-After deliberating for five hours the grand jury at the assizes here yesterday, before Justice Kelly, returned a true bill indicting Dr. Clifford K. Robinson on a charge of having, between July 8th and 14th, murdered Miss Blanche Yorke in the village of Tamworth. "Having heard the charge, are you guilty or not guilty ?" asked the clerk of the court of the accused. Without a tremor in his voice the accused physician replied : "Not guilty." "Are you ready for your trial?"

"Not yet," answered Dr. Robinson. J. A. Hutchinson, K.C., of Brockville, prosecuting counsel, stated that he had been notified by T. C. Robinette, K.U., of Teronto, counsel for the accused, that the defense desired an enlargement of the case until the
