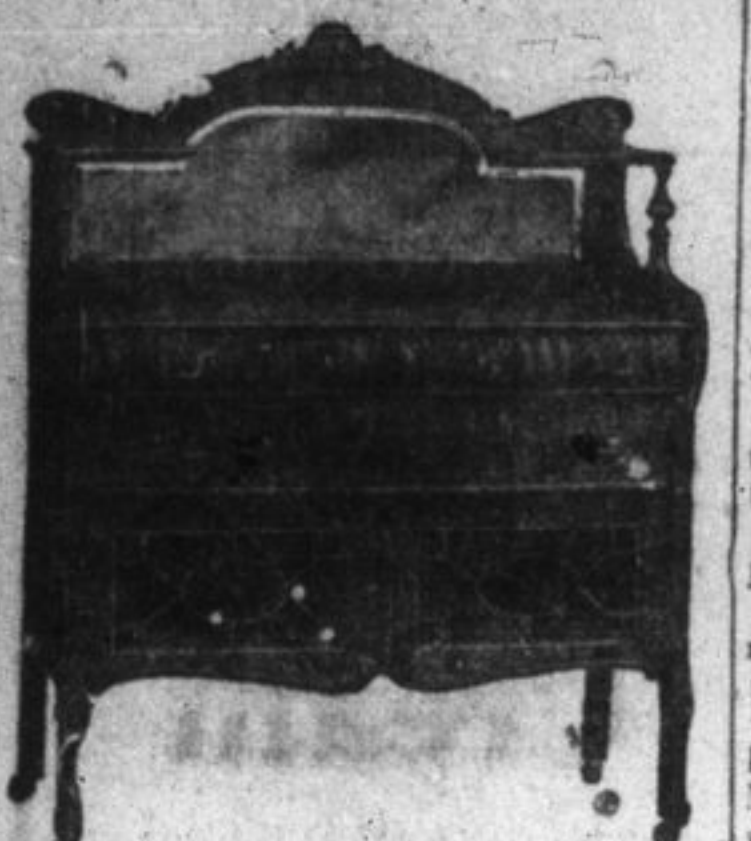

ADMIRALTY'S REPORT

REGARDING THE SINKING OF THREE BRITISH CRUISERS.

Had Naval Rules Been Strictly Carried Out, Only One Of The Vessels Would Have Been Lost.

London, Sept. 26.—The official report concerning the sinking of the British cruisers Aboukir, Hogue and Cressy by German submarines in the North Sea, with a loss of sixty officers and 1,400 men, are contained in an admiralty statement issued last night.

WAR BULLETINS

Antwerp—Germans are retreating from western Belgium, blowing up bridges as they go.

London—Officially announced that large reinforcements have joined the British forces in France.

Paris—There is general feeling here that the battle of the Somme is now about ended and that the allies will be victorious.

Paris—News arrived here Friday evening that the British-French troops, reinforced by Turoos and Hindoo, compelled the retirement of the German right wing with great loss.

Paris—The German centre is greatly weakened by the change of troops to meet the allies' threatening movement on right wing.

Paris—The military authorities refuse to tell the position of the fighting, but it is recognized that the allies compelled the Germans to retreat to St. Quentin.

Rome—The Allies landed in Dalmatia after bombarding Lissa harbor. British and French flags were hoisted to provoke the Austrian fleet to engage the allied fleet.

Paris—Fighting in the centre in dogged fashion on Friday. Artillery kept up fire, aviators hovering above.

Rotterdam—It is understood that several German officers have been court-martialed and shot by Belgians for various atrocities.

Weakened by the allies' assaults the German right is retreating slowly, fighting at close range with fearful losses.

Dublin—Premier Asquith's appeal to Ireland met with thousands of recruits.

A German aviator dropped bombs into Bologna, France, just about half an hour's journey from England.
