DESPATCH BEARERS PRAISED FOR VALOR

British Youths on Dangerous Missions Keep Lines of Communication Open.

At the Battle Front, (Via Paris), Oct. 2.—The generals in command of the allies are full of praise for the corps of despatch riders, who since the beginning of the great battle of the Aisne, have kept up communication between the various corps from the Somme to the Meuse, and along the frontier of Alsace-Lorraine.

The Belgians Slaughtered The Germans

London, Oct. 2.—The Germans failed in several attempts to enter the outer fortifications of Antwerp by storm this morning. This was emphasized by the British official press bureau to-day which reported: "The Germans have repeatedly charged against the Antwerp forts, but in each instance were repulsed with heavy loss. Belgian artillery and rapid fire guns have wrought fearful havoc. The German dead can be counted by thousands. Entire companies have been annihilated."

COAST IN NO DANGER.

Nearest German Ships 5,000 Miles Away.
Ottawa, Oct. 2.—G. F. Desbarrats, deputy minister of the naval service, disposed of a rumor to the effect that the British Columbia coast is in danger from German warships. He states that there are three German cruisers on the Pacific, but the nearest is five thousand miles away. One of them is at Valparaiso, on the coast of Peru, and the other two are at the Fiji Islands.
