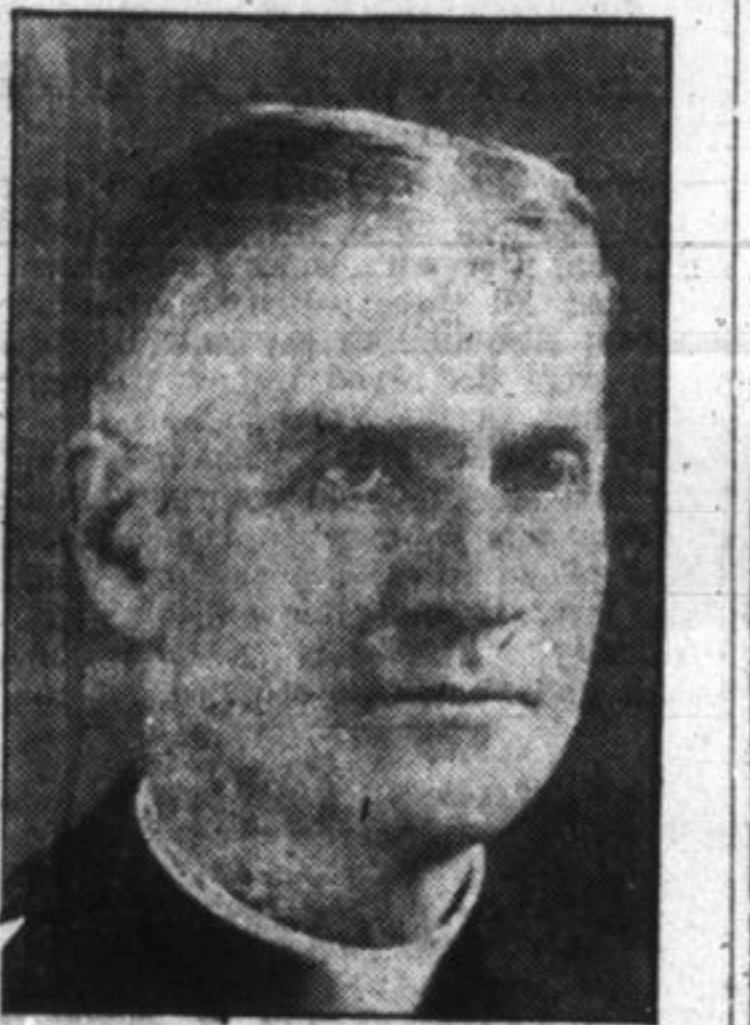
The Curling Groups.
