A FIRE AT NAPANEE

A LIVELY BLAZE IN CAMBRIDGE'S RESTAURANT

Melville Cambridge Grabbed Live Wire During the Progress of the Fire and Was Knocked Out For a Time.

Napanee, Oct. 10.—Damage to the extent of \$800 or \$900 was done to Cambridge's restaurant, in a fire which broke out at 12:30 o'clock Saturday morning. The loss is covered by insurance.

The fire started in the bakery, over one of the ovens. The firemen were on the job as soon as possible, and in three-quarters of an hour's time had the fire under control.

During the progress of the fire, Melville Cambridge, son of the proprietor of the restaurant, who was doing what he could to save the property, grabbed a live wire and was rendered unconscious, but recovered in about half an hour, although he suffered a great deal from shock.
