WAR BULLETINS.

French aviators flew over Strassburg on Friday dropping bombs in German military camps there. The allied forces are pushing forward in Alsace-Lorraine.

Dover, England, is overflowing with Belgian refugees who say that Ostend is already occupied by the Germans, but there is no confirmation.

London police on Friday seized twenty-two Germans in a factory in the heart of London, evidently used as the centre of the German spy system in England.

It is stated in Rome that Cattaro, the Austrian port on the Adriatic, has surrendered to the French-British fleets.

An official report published shows that Britain has lost nine warships since the war began and Germany twelve.

The Holland-American liner Noordam, laden with contraband from New York, has been brought into port at Falmouth, Eng.

Thirteen thousand wounded Belgian soldiers have been landed in England.

There was news in Paris that the German crown prince's army has been compelled to leave the siege of Verdun.

Fierce fighting took place Friday in the Vosges passes, and the Germans were hurled back with heavy losses.

Allies have made still more gains on the extreme ends of the battle lines.

The British have captured a German mine-layer off the mouth of the Thames.

The Berlin war office claims that both Bruges and Ostend have been occupied by Germans.

A German submarine was sunk off Holland by a British dreadnought, which it sought to destroy.

Four hundred thousand Bavarian troops are reinforcing the Germans at the northern end of the line to attack the British.

STUDENTS CORPS.

Arrangements Made By Committee. On Friday.

There was a meeting on Friday afternoon of the committee in charge of the organization of a students corps at Queen's. The members present were: Prof. P. G. Campbell, convener; Profs. G. W. Mitchell, W. T. Connell, L. Malcolm, W. L. Grant, A. Newman, and Dr. F. Etherington.

It was decided that beginning to-day and every day next week from ten o'clock in the morning until four o'clock in the afternoon the names of recruits will be taken in the principal's office.

The first drill will be on Monday afternoon at four o'clock, outside of the gymnasium and in future the drill will be from four until five o'clock in the first few afternoons of the week.

Arrangements for the shooting and route march will be made later. The suggestion was made that science students join the engineers' instead of the student corps.

The medical members—Drs. Etherington and W. T. Connell have formed an ambulance section for the medical students.

Thinks Aid Would be Given. The Napanee Beaver points out that the Mowat Memorial Hospital at Kingston gave during the past years 1277 days' treatment to patients from Lennox and Addington, for which it received nothing. In consideration of so doing, "we think that the county council of Lennox and Addington at their next meeting should make a grant, and we feel sure they will do so if the matter is brought to their attention."

Mrs. Mulloy To Sing. Mrs. Jean Munro Mulloy, who is to sing at the Red Cross patriotic concert in Grant Hall next Thursday evening, is the wife of Prof. Lorne W. Mulloy, of the Royal Military College, the blind trouper-hero of the "Lion" and "The Phantom of the Opera." Her last public appearance was with Ysaye, the famous Belgian violinist.

Patriotic Fund Applications. The Kingston Patriotic fund committee has received ninety-one applications for aid. These include the following: Soldiers' wives 83; children, 150; mothers, 6; daughters, 1; aunts, 1; The applications will require about \$1,500 a month.

FELDSPAR INDUSTRY

TO BE ESTABLISHED IN KINGSTON SHORTLY.

For the Purpose of Manufacturing Potash—Kingston District Has Lots of Feldspar.

C. Schnell of the "Stonemill" Fertilizer Co., of North Paterson, N. J., was in the city on Friday to make arrangements for the erection of a fertilizer manufacturing plant in the city. He is a German-American and in his home in New Jersey is head of a large factory.

This "stonemill" is a fertilizer made from minerals only and is so active that in three years it raised the number of bushels of wheat raised on one farm from 15 to 52 bushels per acre. 10.42 per cent of this fertilizer is potash, 56 per cent iron. In the feldspar of Frontenac county is an average of from 9 per cent to 14 per cent of potash. The spar has formerly been used almost exclusively for the manufacture of enamel-ware and pottery. The feldspar is used for dental purposes.

There are immense beds of feldspar all through Frontenac county that have never been tapped because there is a small percentage of iron in it. In pottery work this iron causes pits in the glaze.

Mr. Schnell proposes to use between 20,000 and 30,000 tons of spar a year. Sometime ago by correspondence the Kingston Board of Trade offered this company a site of six acres near the Tile works site. He proposes a building to cost roughly \$60,000, which would keep between 25 to 50 men working the year round. These men are nearly all laborers and in the New Jersey plant earn \$2.00 for an eight hour day and would be paid the same here.

Potash is the essential element in manufacture of the above fertilizer. In Germany there is an area twelve miles square which is the source of all the potash not in minerals in the world. As soon as this gives signs of running out the exportation of all potash from Germany will cease.

None being exported now and will not be until the close of the war. Feldspar may be purchased in Kingston for \$3.50 a ton. The fertilizer can be sold for \$20 a ton. There is no duty on fertilizers into the United States. Kingston can supply the western part of New York state and Ontario as well as the west.
