CHURCH TIMES, OF LONDON. MAKES 2 STATEMENT.

It Thinks Clergymen Should Stay in Their Parishes Until Their Services Are Actually Required At the Front.

Church Times, London, Eng. The Archbishop of Conterbury's letter on the subject of clergy as combatants was both authoritative and conspicuously sensible. Yet these qualities have not exempted it from public criticism at the hands of a few clergy, whose zeal for military service is certainly not based upon an appreciation of military discipline. Had they their wish of becoming officers on the active list they would not attack in print, whatever their private opinion of its wisdom, an official pronouncement of Lord Kitchener's - at least, they would not do so twice. When, however, the primate publishes his views upon a matter manifestly within his jurisdiction, there are not wanting junior clergy who, by means of letters to the press, kindly undertake the task of setting him right. As for the question itself, argument upon it is almost needless. It is one far less of canon law than of good taste and decency. 
