### OF THE BATTALION THAT IS TO BE MOBILIZED HERE

It Will Be 1,031 Strong — Each Company Will Have 110 Men — Machine Gun Section of Eighteen.

The organization and mobilization in Kingston of the 3rd divisional battalion of war will be something unique in military circles. This battalion will consist of 1,031 men of all ranks who will go overseas as a unit. The war establishment will not be the same as described in "Infantry Training 1914," as this book provides for a four company battalion, each of which is really double the strength of the old companies.

The war establishment of the 3rd divisional battalion will consist of thirty-four officers including attached. These are one lieutenant-colonel, two majors, one adjutant, one quarter-master, one transport officer, one signal officer, eight company commanders, sixteen lieutenants, one machine-gun officer and the two attached officers the medical and paymaster.

The strength of a company will be 110 men, consisting of one captain, two subalterns, one color-sergeant, two sergeants, two drummers, or buglers, five corporals, one pioneer, ninety-four privates, two signallers, two stretcher-bearers, two drivers (for the first line transports and three batmen.)

The machine-gun section will total eighteen men. The headquarters staff, including attached will total sixty-one.

### MEN IN HARD LUCK

WILL BE TOLD TO ENLIST FOR THE FRONT

This is the Advice Police Will Give to Men Seeking Shelter at the Police Station — Magistrate Has Sworn Large Number of Recruits.

With the call for volunteers ringing out all over Ontario there will be no excuse for men who come to the police station and ask for protection stating that they are out of work and cannot get anything to do.

From now on they will be told to enlist for the front. Last fall and winter scores of men were given shelter at the police station and each one had a hard-luck story to tell about being unable to get work. Already this fall a half dozen or so knights of the road have called at the police station and have been given shelter. From now on a close tab will be kept on these men and they will be asked to fight at the front. If a man is out of work these days and simply cannot get work, the best place for him is at the front fighting for his country.

During the past few days Magistrate Farrell has sworn in over one hundred recruits for the new battery. The men hail from different parts of the country, and are a fine looking lot of able-bodied men who are anxious to get to the front to fight the Germans. For the most part they are men who have been out of employment, but there are also quite a number of men who have given up positions, some life and all that is dear to them to aid the mother country.

And in view of the fact that so many men are needed, the advice at police headquarters in the future to all men who are seeking shelter will be "go to the front."
