She was held at Lough Swilly county Donegal, or some time only one passenger, Charles M. Schwab, was allowed to land and there.

Reports have been freely circulated that the Olympic actually found a mine, but that it failed to explode.

### Authentic Pictures Of The War.

### Better Apply At Once.

The Whig was informed on Tuesday that all veterans who have been awarded grants of land by the government in the vest for service rendered in the Fenian Raid, North West rebellion and the Boer war, had better make application for the same at once. If they fail to do so, there is a possibility that they may have to do settlement duty. This is a new order issued by the dominion officials. In case any have to do settlement duty, it will be required of them to clear ten acres of land for four years.

### Apply Nobel Prize to Refugees.

The Hague, Nov. 3.—The Handeblad, of Amsterdam, has published a report from Christiania saying that the manager of the Nobel Institute has decided to give this year's peace prize, which amounts to about \$40,000, to the Netherlands government to be applied toward the support of Belgian refugees in Holland.
