"L'HERMINI VERMEIL LOMAX But French Press Is Not Allowed to Substantiate Belief.

London, Nov. 5.—A Paris despatch to the Standard, dated Monday, says:

"The papers are not allowed to give any details to substantiate their belief, but more than one declares itself in a position to affirm that the Germans are hurriedly preparing to retreat, and may start falling back in force at any moment. Particulars have already appeared in the London press of the different defensive works thrown up by the enemy to enable them to clear out of Belgium in the best possible order, while telegrams have arrived here, stating that similar preparations are being made on the eastern frontier and in Alsace, particularly near Strassburg."

"Some nervousness is observable also here. The discussion now in progress in England as to the probability of invasion should cause a falling off in the despatch of British troops to the continent. Even the Temps takes a considerable amount of trouble to demonstrate that the fate of Britain is being decided now in the battle of the Yser. The surest way to guarantee England's safety against danger, it says, is for the allies to give the Germans a sound drubbing in the battle now in progress."

In Fire in Waverley Hotel, 8th Avenue, New York.

New York, Nov. 5.—Six men were burned almost to a crisp, and many were saved through thrilling rescues by firemen and police to-day, when fire gutted Waverley hotel, a lodging house on Eighth avenue. The six dead were burned in their beds, or caught in hallways as they rushed through the flames in a futile effort to reach safety.
