SATURDAY'S MARKET PRICES.

A Refund Made On Eggs Not Strictly Fresh.

There was a good-sized market on Saturday morning with a plentiful supply of chickens at 75c to 90c a pair; apples at 30c to 40c a peck; butter at 30c to 35c a lb., and eggs selling as high as 50c a dozen for strictly fresh.

One lady on Thursday charged a man 45c a dozen for what she called strictly fresh eggs and on Saturday she had to make a refund, as they were certainly not what she said.

Fowl sold at \$1 to \$1.25 a pair, turkeys at \$1.50 to \$2 each and ducks at \$1 to \$1.25 a pair. Beef was selling at 7c to 9c a lb., by the cwt, pork at 11c to 13c a lb., by the quarter, lamb, 15c to 16c a lb., by the quarter, and mutton, 12c to 14c a lb., by the quarter.

W. Gowan, the government inspector of potatoes, after making an inspection of the potato crop of the county, reports that the county is free from the injurious species of scab that has been more or less prevalent west of here.
