## THE COUNTY COUNCIL

### OPENED ITS NOVEMBER SESSION TUESDAY AFTERNOON.

Members To Be Warden Kennedy's Guests On a Trip to Napanee Thursday — To Increase Court House Insurance.

The Frontenac County Council has an advantage over the City Council. It meets in the day time, and is, therefore, able to sit with the Union Jack floating over the court house tower, while it transacts the king's business. The county councillors are now holding their November session, having convened on Tuesday afternoon, and will adjourn at the week-end.

All members were present at the opening session. Mr. Warden J. A. Kennedy and Councillors John Gray, P. J. Wensley, H. A. Calvin, John Foley, C. G. McNight, T. O. Hawkey, Benson Coulter, L. D. Parks, Charles Truscott, Abbot Thompson, Robert McVeigh, W. J. Franklin, J. E. Freeman, James Halliday, W. J. Donaldson, J. B. Sleeth and Dr. William Spangale.

Adjournment was made until Wednesday morning, when these communications were read:

From Hon. George E. Foster, minister of trade and commerce, asking that no more penalizable communications from the county people to Ottawa be sent forward, owing to the closing of navigation on the St. Lawrence.

Union school sections No. 1, Bedford, and No. 6, North Crosby, asking for the lease of a portion of a road allowance for the enlargement of the school grounds.

W. A. McLean, provincial commissioner of roads, stating that the government would hold a four days' course of instruction for county road superintendents in Toronto, in February, and asking the Frontenac council to send its usual representation.

Councillor Halliday stated that he understood the insurance on the court house had about expired. He wanted to know if steps were being taken to have the policies renewed.

County Treasurer Purdy informed the council that the insurance was due Wednesday noon. He intended to pay \$25,000. The custom was to renew the policies when they became due. His standing instructions were to that effect.

Councillor Freeman thought the insurance should be doubled. The risk of fire was too great to take any chance. Furthermore, the premium was very small.

Treasurer Purdy remarked that insurance money now would not go much further than half the distance it would have some five years ago, in case of a big fire.

"It wouldn't much more than clean up the debris," said Councillor Freeman.

On motion of Councillor Halliday it was decided to increase the insurance to \$50,000, renewing the present policies and authorizing the treasurer to place an additional \$25,000 on the buildings.

Councillor Wensley moved seconded by Councillor Freeman, that the chairman of the road and bridges committee meet with the chairman of the Lennox and Addington committee and report in January upon the bridge and boundary line between the township of Miller and Frontenac and Addington county. The bridge was impassable, and the councils of the two counties were responsible for it.

High County Constable John Purdy was present at the Wednesday morning session, acting in the capacity as sergeant-at-arms, but as the council of 1914 is composed of an amiable body of men, he had plenty of time to take a snooze if he wished.

On Thursday afternoon the councillors will be the warden's guests on a pleasure trip to Napanee, where a visit will be paid to the Lennox and Addington council which is in session this week. The two bodies will fraternize in the evening.

### ALD. SUTHERLAND TO RUN.

Will be Candidate For Mayor in Coming Elections.

ALD. R. D. Sutherland will be a candidate for mayor. He has decided to accede to the request of a large number of citizens who petitioned him on Tuesday to be a candidate, and on Wednesday morning announced that he would be in the field. His card announcing his candidature appears in the Whig to-day.

With Ald. T. F. Harrison and Ald. R. D. Sutherland in the field, the mayoralty campaign is now well under way. There has been some talk that Mayor Shaw would likely seek re-election, but thus far his worship is keeping mum on the subject.

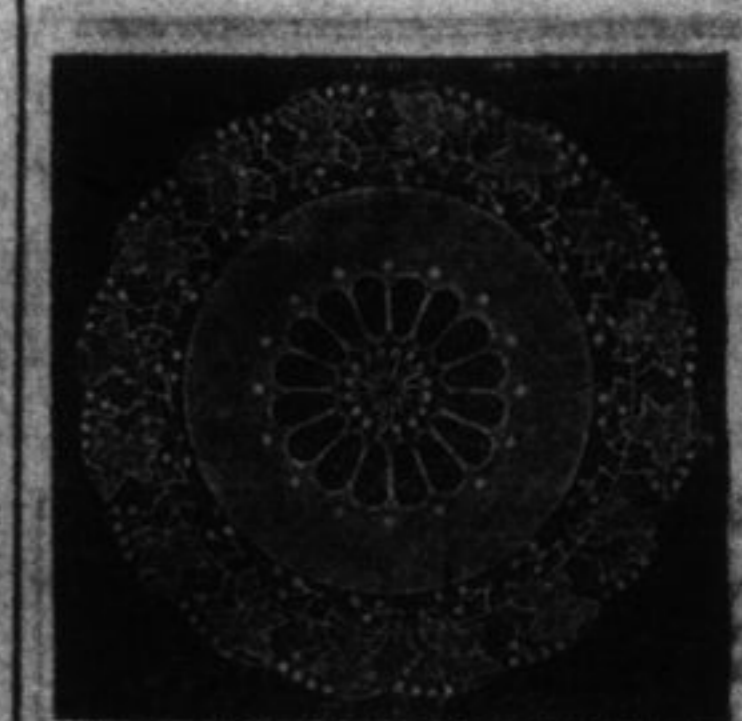
